ROAD WORKS

Rolleston Drive Upgrade

Work will soon begin in Rolleston Drive to widen the stretch between Tennyson Street and Masefield Drive and install a roundabout at the Tennyson Street intersection. When finished, this will help reduce traffic congestion and make the intersection safer.

The roads will not be closed during the construction period but short delays are likely. So we advise drivers to take alternative routes where possible.

If you do drive near the construction area, please respect the reduced speed limit (30 km/hr) and the contractor's road signs.

DOG MICROCHIPPING

If your dog was first registered after 30 June 2006 and is not a working dog, the law requires him or her to be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following Council service centres on Friday of next week - Friday **30 January** – at the following times:

Lincoln	Leeston	Rolleston	Darfield
1-2pm	3-4pm	11-12noon	9-10am

Please note:

- Rolleston microchipping is at the Selwyn District Council head office in Norman Kirk Drive, off Rolleston Drive.
- Microchipping will not take place if wet.
- Working dogs and dogs registered before 1 July 2006 can be microchipped for \$20 per dog.

AGRECOVERY – USE IT OR LOSE IT

Free drop-off bin for empty containers

Farmers and contractors, what do you do with your empty spray and drench containers? Did you know that you can drop them for free in the Agrecovery bin at the Resource Recovery Park near Rolleston? From there, they'll be taken away for recycling.

Just wash the containers (three rinses, minimum) and make sure that their brand names are visible - or that they have an Agrecovery sticker.

The Agrecovery service is free for any container whose company pays into the scheme. To date, these companies are: Adria, Agronica, BASF, Bayer, BioAg, Virbac, Botryzen, GF, Dow AgroSciences, Du Pont, Elliott technologies, Elanco, HortiCentre, Key Industries, Gro-Chem, Schring-Plough Coopers, Mantissa, Orion, SST, Ravensdown, Syngenta, Nufarm, Zelam.

But some companies haven't yet joined the Agrecovery scheme. To drop off their containers, you'll need to buy and attach an Agrecovery sticker. The cost of the sticker helps pay for the container's handling and transport.

The Agrecovery bin came to Rolleston last year, but word was slow to get around. At one point there was talk of removing the service because not 1. Weather conditions must be suitable. enough people were using it. For now, the bin is still there, but it's future is up to you - it's a simple case of use it or lose it.

CROP RESIDUE BURN-OFFS

With the restricted fire season still in effect, the burning of crop stubble may only be done (without a permit) under certain conditions. For the full

set of conditions, refer to our website www.selwyn.govt. nz/fire/burnoff-guidelines-r.htm Some of the most important

- 2. The area to be burnt must be surrounded by a strip of cleared bare mineral earth at least 10 metres wide.
- 3. The fire must be patrolled by the person lighting it until the fire is completely out.
- 4. Burning must only occur during daylight hours.
- 5. The occupiers of neighbouring properties must be informed beforehand of the date and time of burning.
- 6. Some form of fire-fighting equipment, such as grubbers, beaters, fire extinguishers or truck mounted water supply/ spray unit(s) must be available for dealing with any fire outbreaks.

How to make a submission


If you wish to support or oppose a consent application you must get a written submission on Form 13 or to the like effect into any Council Service Centre by **Thursday** 19 February 2009, and promptly send a copy to the applicant's service address. Your submission should be addressed to Helen Allison, Planning Administrator. It must be signed and dated by you, and must state:

- your name, postal address, phone or fax
- the applicants' name, number and location
- whether you support or oppose the application
- your reasons
- · the decision you wish us to make
- · whether you wish to speak at a hearing

sometimes with coloured paving and handrails, to help school patrols control traffic and safely guide children across the road.

A **kea crossing** only operates before and after school, and possibly at lunch time, in the presence of a school patrol and two fluorescent orange crossing point flag signs (one on each side of the road). When the school patrol displays its STOP signs, traffic must stop.

When no school patrol and no crossing signs are present, the crossing point is just like any other section of road. Because vehicles are not obliged to give way, pedestrians should always stop, look, and listen before crossing the road.
