Driving in Fog

One of my biggest pet peeves coming into winter is not the change of weather, but drivers who don't turn their car lights on in fog. Surely it's common sense for your safety and that of others on the road.



Here's an example. A couple of weeks ago it was foggy and I was turning left onto Shands Road (one of our high-risk crash roads). In the back of my mind I was thinking: 'What if a driver is coming at 100km/h down Shands Road without their car lights on?"

I looked, saw nothing, turned onto Shands Road and then. sure enough, a car sped up behind me with horn blaring - and lights off. We were both very lucky!

Please, please, please !

- When driving in fog adjust your speed to the visibility
 - Keep your headlights dipped on low beam. Lights on high beam will reflect off fog and produce glare, further reducing your ability to see.
- Fog lamps should not be used unless visibility is severely reduced, e.g. by snow or fog. Many drivers do not know that it is unlawful to use fog lamps in clear conditions (day or night) because they can dazzle other road users.
- Keep a generous following distance between you and the car in front.

for the Lincoln Community Centre

Selwyn District Council requires an area of 1.72 hectares next to the Lincoln Domain to be designated in the District Plan for:

- the building, operation and maintenance of a community centre and recreation facilities; and
- any other land use by the council for community or recreation purposes

The vacant, undeveloped, site is owned by the council and is zoned as Living 1A2. It is on part of the "Vege Block", bounded by the (yet to be formed) William Street Extension (east), North Belt (south) and the Lincoln Domain/Reserve (west) within Lincoln Township. Its legal description is Lot 1 DP 301682.

The Notice of Requirement can be read on the council website and at council service centres and libraries.

Any person or organisation may write a submission to the council supporting or opposing the designation. It must include all the information required in Form 21 of the Resource Management Regulations (which is available from any council service centre and from the website).


