

Two, one or none?

As proposed in the Draft Community Plan, the district would have two aquatic centres - one in Lincoln and one in Rolleston – each with a variety of pools and recreation facilities.

However, the council is open to other options as well – such as having only one aquatic centre for the district. But, if so, where? A Rolleston facility would cost nearly \$8 million, and a Lincoln one, nearly \$6 million. Write your thoughts down and send them in to us as a submission on the Draft Community Plan.


Whichever option is chosen, the Draft Plan proposes to pay for these pools through a graded rating system – though this too is not set in stone. If you prefer other rating systems please make a submission telling us.

Under the graded system, ratepayers living within 10 km of the pools would pay \$200 per year (\$4 per week). This would drop to \$100 beyond 10km, \$50 beyond 20km and \$25 beyond 30km. That's for two pool centres.

But if only one were built, the top rate would be about \$136 per year (roughly \$2.60 per week) - not \$165 as printed in an earlier edition - and the others would also fall accordingly.

So, in sending us your views on the proposal, you are not restricted to a "take it or leave it" option. That's what the word Draft means in Draft Community Plan. If you prefer only one pool and a different rating system, please write down your reasons and send them to us. But please do it soon. Find out more about the Draft Community Plan at www.selwyn. govt.nz or at any of our service centres and libraries.


