CROSS SECTIONS – WHAT'S THE POINT?

Cross section drawings can help speed up your building consent by telling us how the work complies with the Building Code. Cross sections are cut-through views, which show key construction details.

But to be of use, they must be specific, showing the actual details of your project. Generic cross sections are of no help because they do not give these details.

The best place for a cross section is through any complex or difficult part of the building. It should show ground levels, wall heights, framing sizes, spacings, grading and treatment, roof and ceiling pitches, and the materials that you will use. It should also refer to other construction details, such as flashings, junctions or the like.
