

Don't drink that first cup of water

When your tap has been off for a few hours, minute traces of metal can dissolve into the still water from some of the fittings. From there, they can get into your first cup of water for the morning or evening.

The solution is simple: don't drink that first cupful – use it instead on the pot plants or add it to the dishwater (it's safe there if the dishes are rinsed).

"The health risk is low," says the Christchurch Medical Officer of Health, Dr Alistair Humphrey. "However, we recommend this simple precaution for all households in New Zealand, including those on public and private water supplies in the Selwyn District."
