So, before getting one installed, the first thing you will need is a building consent. Then, after the installation, you will need to have it inspected by a Council inspector. You are charged for this when your building consent is issued.

If your heater is an in-built one, you will also need to have the cavity inspected before installation. Obviously this extra inspection costs more but we think that it is necessary to give greater safety assurance to homeowners.

A poor installation is simply not worth the risk to life and property.


What to do if you have the flu



RESOURCE CONSENTS

Because of their possible environmental effects, many activities need a resource consent from the Council. You have the right to inspect the following consent applications at any Council Service Centre during normal office hours and to make a submission supporting or opposing them.

Springs Ward

Corner of Cossars and Gerkins Roads

Chapman Hall Trust (Application 095086) seeks to erect a dwelling on the Port Hills with an approximate footprint of 780 sq metres and up to 7.8 metres in height above existing ground level with (Application 085401) associated earthworks to form a building platform and vehicle access. The land is at the corner of Cossars and Gerkins Roads on Part of Rural Section 2960. The applicant's address for service is C/- Aurecon, PO Box 1061, Christchurch 8140 (Attn: Mark Allan).

How to make a submission

If you wish to support or oppose a consent application you must get a written submission on Form 13 or to the like effect into any Council Service Centre by Thursday 6 August 2009, and promptly send a copy to the applicant's service address. Your submission should be addressed to Helen Allison, Planning Administrator. It must be signed and dated by you, and must state:

- your name, postal address, phone or fax
- · the applicants' name, number and location
- whether you support or oppose the application
- your reasons
- the decision you wish us to make
- whether you wish to speak at a hearing
 (This notice is issued under Section 93(2) of the Resource
 Management Act 1991.)

- \$30 for the first dog
- \$20 for each additional dog owned by the same person and living at the same place.

Payment after 31 July 2009 will cost:

- \$45 for the first dog
- \$30 for each additional dog owned by the same person and living at the same place.

Tag and Collar Fees (Inclusive of GST)

The fee for a replacement dog tag is \$5 and for a dog collar \$6-\$8, depending on the size.

SUBMISSIONS INVITED ON Plan Change 11: Rolleston Living 1B Deferred Zone Structure Plan



Your views are invited on Plan Change 11 which will alter the subdivision rules in Rolleston's Living 1B Deferred zone around Lowes Road and Brookside Road (see map).

The zone has a minimum section size of 5000m² but this will expire in January 2010, allowing landowners to subdivide if they wish.

To make this happen in an orderly, attractive way, retaining some of the zone's established character, we have drafted a structure plan which:

- says where any new roads, footpaths and reserves will go; and
- rezones minimum section sizes to:
- standard residential (Living 1) in the northern part (yellow on the map)
- low density residential (Living 1B) in the southern part (light green)
- large, with specific rules for areas of special character within

Waterbridge Way and Fairhurst Place (Living 1C, blue).

The structure plan was drafted with lots of advice and suggestions from local residents and the wider community. The Council now wishes to give the plan legal force by including it in the District Plan through Plan Change 11.

"The area has been zoned for intensification for some time now and is quite central within the town boundaries," said Strategic Planner, David Hattam. "It has an attractive character and we would like to retain some of this as it is developed. But we need to cater for the needs of future urban residents as well as the current landowners. It is especially important to get some roads, walkways and cycleways through the area."
