PAPER ON ALCOHOL **ISSUES TARGETS OUR DRINKING CULTURE**



Alcohol in Our Lives is an issues paper which reviews the sale and supply of liquor regulations. This recentlyreleased, but well overdue, report gives me the opportunity to express my views, and I encourage you all to do the

In outlining the various problems – and some of the benefits – associated with alcohol consumption in New Zealand, the report also offers a range of ideas for reform. It discusses and comes up with options on:

- the alcohol purchase/ drinking age,
- licensed (local pubs and cafes) premises hours,
- off-licence (bottle stores)
- product labelling and serving sizes, excise tax, alcohol

penalties, and -

- advertising, alcohol pricing, enforcement and
- the lowering the blood alcohol limit to 50 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood.

As many of you will know just changing one aspect of our sale and supply laws or regulations will not affect our drinking culture; it will take a combination (and many years) of changes and initiatives to influence New Zealand's alcohol consumption behaviour.

Households with organics wheelie bins are getting new bins for their organic waste. These bins have lime-green lids and should be used for your garden and kitchen waste from the first collection day after you get them. Your old yellow-lidded bin will become your recycling bin and should be used for recycling, not compost, from Monday 28 September.

When your bin is delivered, you will also get a fridge magnet with collection dates and a sticker under the bin lid showing what can be recycled.

Special arrangements are being made for off-route properties, and information has been posted to these properties.
