

# 2010 LOCAL ELECTIONS **Additional councillor proposed**

The Local Electoral Act requires councils to undertake six-yearly reviews of their ward boundaries and the number of councillors and other elected representatives they need. As part of this review, the Council held public meetings and invited comments on several different representation

After considering the public's comments, the Council, on 26 August, made an initial proposal to add another councillor to the Selwyn Central Ward, because of this ward's population growth, increasing the number from 3 to 4, and increasing the overall number of councillors from 10 to 11.

The Council proposes to leave all other aspects of the current system unchanged, including the number of councillors in the other wards, the ward boundaries, and the Malvern and Selwyn Central • community boards.

The rubbish and organic waste collections will continue to be weekly. The only difference is that the organic waste will now be collected in lime-top wheelie bins rather than yellow-top ones. If you already have your lime-top bin, please begin using it now for organic waste.
