The new fortnightly recycling collection commenced this week, from Monday 28 September.

#### Properties on the collection routes

must use recycling wheelie bins with yellow coloured lids for their recyclables. Black crates from on-route properties will not be collected. Please contact the Council's Helpline if you have not received a recycling wheelie bin.

Organic collection subscribers – please contact the Helpline if your organic bin has not been exchanged for one with a lime-green coloured lid. Please note that the contractor will not empty organics that are left out in yellow lidded bins.

Properties that are not on a collection route, but use the recycling collection, may still use the black recycling crates and will be issued with an additional second crate to compensate for the fortnightly collection. Those properties that use the Tuesday to Friday collections should receive their second crate this week. There may be a delay in delivering additional crates to off-route properties that use the Monday collection but these should be delivered by 10 October.

Properties that are not on a collection route should continue to leave their recycling crates out weekly for collection until they receive their second crate, when they should change to the fortnightly collection sequence. Please contact Council Helpline if your second crate has not been delivered by Saturday 10 October.

Surplus wheelie bins will be collected after other deliveries have been completed. Please leave bins that need to be returned by your driveway inside your property, where the collectors can see them from the road.

#### A GENEALOGICAL BREAKTHROUGH

Genealogy is one of the fastest-growing hobbies in New Zealand, and in light of the interest in Local History across Selwyn, and the upcoming launch of Kete Selwyn in November (more info later on this) the Selwyn Library has taken a 12-month subscription, beginning on 1 October, to Ancestry Library Edition.



**Ancestry** is an enormous worldwide resource which contains Birth, Marriage and Death data on millions of people, census data, military records, shipping records and many user-made family trees. At present it contains very little New Zealand-specific data – it's mainly US and Europe – but of course it continues to grow.

Library members will be able to use this from home with their barcode/PIN (LIBRARY, ONLINE TOOLS, login, ANCESTRY), as well as in the libraries, where some library staff who are already familiar

with **Ancestry** will be able to help users.


