NEW ROAD USER RULES

On 1 November 2009, new road user rules come into effect. The rules include:

- Drivers cannot use hand-held mobile phones while driving.
- Drivers and drugs
- Motorcyclists and moped riders must use headlights at all times
- Clarification of how to use special vehicle lanes.

Drivers must not use a hand-held mobile phone, unless the device is completely handsfree or mounted securely to the vehicle. Writing, reading or sending text messages, or using other features of a mobile phone while driving is illegal.



Another important new rule coming into effect on 1 November concerns Driving and Drugs. Police will conduct compulsory tests on drivers they suspect of driving under the influence of drugs. If you are unsure whether you can safely drive on your medication, consult your pharmacist or prescription information.

POOL PLANS UNDERWAY

The indoor swimming pool at Rolleston came a step closer this month. The Council has set up a Steering Group and Project Team and asked them to develop a concept design and new funding options for the pool.

A survey in April found that 80 percent of Selwyn's people like the idea of an indoor pool for the district. Most (60 percent) prefer a single centre rather than the two proposed by the Council and most (60 percent again) support having a pool in Rolleston. But they were split on funding.

Based on this, the Council revised its two-pool proposal and its distance-based rating system and voted "in principle" to build one pool centre in Rolleston, subject to a review of funding options.

The new options will be included in the draft budget next year and residents will be able to make submissions on them then.

OG MICROCHIPPING



If your dog was first registered after **30 June 2006** and is not a working dog, the law requires him or her to be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following Council service centres.

Important:

- Rolleston microchipping is at Council offices in Norman Kirk Drive.
- Microchipping will not take place if wet.
- Working dogs and dogs registered before 1 July 2006 can be microchipped for \$20 per dog.

It has now become much easier! Because genealogy is one of the fastest-growing hobbies in New Zealand, the Selwyn Library has taken a 12-month subscription to Ancestry Library Edition.

Ancestry is an enormous worldwide resource which contains Birth, Marriage and Death data on millions of people, census data, military records, shipping records and many user-made family trees. At present it's mainly US and European (including UK) – but of course it continues to grow.

You can use **Ancestry** from home with your barcode/pin (just go to LIBRARY, ONLINE TOOLS, **login**, **ANCESTRY**) as well as in the libraries, where some library staff, already familiar with **Ancestry**, are helping
