

DOING BUILDING WORK?

From Monday, 1 February, getting a Project Information Memorandum (PIM) for your building consent application is now voluntary.

PIMs can be very useful in planning a project, giving information on such things as:

- Wind zones, snow loads, flood
- Location of water, drainage and sewerage pipes
- The need for approvals from other authorities The need for a resource consent,
- and why The need to pay capital contributions, development contributions, water
- and sewerage connection fees Access requirements

We recommend getting a PIM if such information would help your building work. If you are not sure, call our building team on 347 2839 or 318 8338.

LET'S TALK ABOUT RATES (and other stuff)

Have your say at a public meeting

In its Draft Annual Budget, to be released for public submissions on 24 March, the council will propose some rates increases for:

- Sewerage
- Swimming pools
- water
- Refuse collection
- Reserves Libraries
- · Community centres and halls

Although the economy is gradually improving, the council is mindful of the strain that rate increases might place on some ratepayers and is carefully considering which rates to increase and by how much.

Unfortunately some increases are necessary to ensure adequate funding for the services which the council provides to the community.

You are invited to a public meeting in your area to hear about and comment on the proposed rate changes.

Key discussion points will include:

- whether smaller rate increases spread over time are better than large catch-up increases; and
- a revised proposal for a Selwyn District Indoor Pool at Rolleston;.

- children are about! Here are some tips for reducing chaos at the school gate:

- · Reduce speed around schools
- Remember "20 is Plenty" (km/h that is)
- Ensure that children wear their safety vests for increased visibility
- Walk or wheel to and from school
- Join or start a walking school bus
- Get your school involved in the WOWOW programme
- Practice road safety tips in the "Roadsmart" parent guide
- Practice safe walking tips in the "Feet First" parent guide
- Join your school in the Feet First and Roadsense programmes
- If dropping off children by car, spend one more minute and use the school car park – especially at rural schools – and keep your children away from 100km/h roads
- If driving, then walking, park further away
