

FOOTSTEPS TO FEELING SAFE


Footsteps to Feeling Safe' is a Barnardos programme for 5-13 year old children from homes where domestic violence has led to a protection order.

HOWEVER, because the April meeting would fall on Easter Monday, the NEXT meeting is on 29 March. All welcome.


