### PLAN CHANGE 11 – Rolleston Living 1B Deferred Zone Structure Plan

This change to the District Plan concerns the area around East Maddisons Road, Lowes Road and Brookside Road which was until recently zoned as Living 1B deferred. The deferral was lifted in January 2010 and subdivision has been possible since then. The Plan Change is aimed at establishing the position of new roads and walkways in the area.

The Plan Change was the subject of a hearing in October and November 2009. Some modifications have been made as a result of the hearing. (See the commissioner's report at Council service centres or on our website.)

The Council has now approved the Structure Plan for inclusion in the District Plan.

### PUBLIC NOTICE PROPOSED PLAN CHANGE 11 ROLLESTON LIVING 1B DEFERRED ZONE STRUCTURE PLAN

The Selwyn District Council has accepted the Commissioner's Recommendation to approve, with amendments, Plan Change 11 – Rolleston Living 1B Deferred Zone Structure Plan. The Plan Change is concerned with the part of Rolleston which was until January 2010 zoned as Living 1B deferred and with an adjacent parcel of land (726 East Maddisons Road). The changes are intended to manage the transition of this area to urban use.

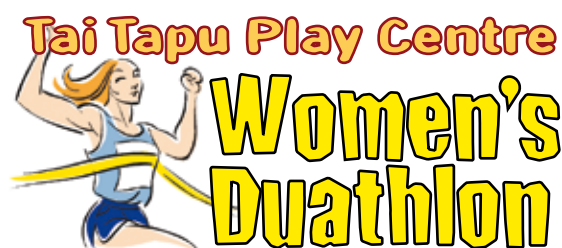

### FIRE RESTRICTIONS STILL APPLY

The Plains are very dry in places and, with no significant rain forecast for the next few days, **the fire danger is becoming severe.**

Some people are still lighting fires without a permit and risking not only destruction but also prosecution, fire crew costs, and liability and insurance issues.

Our fire crews have lately been called out to many escaped fires caused by (1) poor fire breaks, (2) ignoring the weather conditions, and (3) not watching the fires.

**The answers are simple!** (a) Get a fire permit; (b) Follow the rules; and best of all (c) Don't burn until the fire restrictions are lifted and conditions are less extreme.

If you haven't had a chance to read it yet, here are some key extracts from the Selwyn Swimming Pools information sheet.

#### What's in the new pool plan?

- Improvements to Darfield and Southbridge pools
- A new indoor 4-pool swimming centre for the district, based in Rolleston, with:
  1. a main pool, 25 metres long and 8 lanes wide, for lane swimming, small-scale competitions, aqua-jogging, learn-to-swim (adults and older children), general fun and play, leisure and fitness.
  2. an 18-metre by 6-metre learn-to-swim pool for younger children.
  3. a leisure pool with 'beach' access, a 'lazy river' and separate toddlers' area - perfect for toddlers, children, older adults, people with disabilities and

families having fun.

4. a warm pool offering relaxation and therapy for older adults, people with disabilities and those needing rehabilitation.

#### What has changed since last year?

- One pool centre, not two.
- \$12 million, not \$14 million.
- Top rate \$124, not \$200.
- More pools under one roof.
- More scope for future expansion (e.g. fitness centre, hydroslide, sports hall).

#### How will the \$12 million be paid?

- Half the money will come from funds held by the Rolleston community.
- Some will come from external grants.
- The rest will come from a loan which will be paid off through a new district-wide swimming pool rate.
- The new swimming pool rate will replace all existing rate payments for swimming pools and will also pay for the upkeep of the outdoor summer pools in

Darfield, Sheffield, Southbridge, Leeston and Prebbleton.

- The proposed new rate will start next year, from 1 July 2011.

#### What will it cost ratepayers?

- Rolleston ratepayers will pay around \$124 per year (about \$2.40 per week).
- Most other Selwyn ratepayers will pay about \$87 per year (\$1.70 per week).
- Ratepayers along the upper Selwyn River, and in the more remote areas of the district, will pay around \$31 (60 cents per week).
