- Switch on your hazard lights or an amber beacon if you are using a vehicle.
- Wear high visibility garments for your and other road users' safety.

The Restricted Fire Season for the rural plains of Selwyn District was lifted at midnight, Tuesday 18 May.

Fires in the rural plains may now be lit without a fire permit. You must still take care when lighting fires, because if a fire gets out of control, the person who lit it is legally liable for any fire-fighting costs.

Before lighting, therefore, please give due attention to weather conditions, adequacy of fire breaks, having the fire patrolled until completely out, and time of day - please do not light open-air fires after dark.

ALSO, you cannot light an open-air fire:

- in the hill and high country, unless you have a permit from the council
- in Department of Conservation (DOC) land and Fire Control areas, unless you have a permit from DOC
- in residential areas, unless you have resource consent from Environment Canterbury (ECAN)
- in any Selwyn Plantation Board forest.

Rural fire restrictions may be reimposed if changed weather conditions create a potentially dangerous fire situation.
