SELWYN DISTRICT PLAN PLAN CHANGE 10

Rezoning of Rural Land for Business Purposes and to Introduce a New Business 2A Zone at Rolleston

The Selwyn District Council has accepted the Commissioner's Recommendation to approve, with amendments, **Plan Change 10 – Rezoning 49ha of rural land for business purposes and to introduce a new Business 2A Zone at Rolleston**. Plan Change 10 provides further land for business purposes as well as providing an integrated set of policies and rules and one Outline Development Plan for all of the Izone Southern Business Hub.

Anyone who made a submission on Plan Change 10 may appeal to the Environment Court against the Council's decision. Appeals must be in the prescribed form as set out in Form 7 and must reach the Court within 30 working days of receiving notice of the decision from the Council.

LEARN HOW TO GAUGE HOW TIRED YOU ARE

Just outside our district at Easter Weekend was a crash involving the death of a cyclist, hit by a car driven by a woman who had fallen asleep at the wheel. This reminds us about the risks and consequences of driving when tired – **it's a hidden killer!**

Being tired significantly raises the risk of a crash, because we become less alert to what is happening on the road, and less able to react in a dangerous situation.

This Queen's Birthday Weekend **please remember to:**

- After a long day's work, get a good night's sleep before setting out on a long trip.
- Be aware of your biological clock – we all have our slowdown patches during the day, and
- Avoid driving at high-risk times (1am-6am)

On long drives, **make a point of:**

- Taking rest breaks – every 90 minutes
- Taking food breaks and eating properly
- Stopping, resting and stretching when tired, and
- Swapping drivers, where possible

Attention Restricted Drivers and Your Parents!

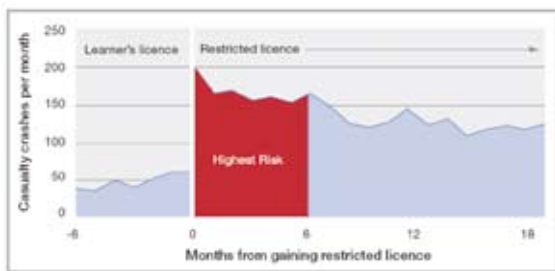
Going Solo is a free booklet produced by the AA for Restricted Licence car drivers and their parents. The booklet contains:

- Facts about the restricted licence
- Facts on driving risks faced by restricted licence holders
- Ways to reduce the risks
- A contract for parents and restricted licence holders (Driving Agreement)

The highest crash risk period for all drivers is the first six months after gaining your restricted licence. Restricted licence drivers are four times more likely to have a crash than learner drivers, because unlike the learner driver, you face high-risk situations alone.

Parents play a key role in guiding and promoting safe driving habits. The **Going Solo** booklet explains ways you parents can help your restricted licence driver when he or she begins to drive alone.

Hey, dog owners!
It's that time again!
Dog registration starts in July

It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is registered, and the penalties for non-registration can be expensive. All dogs older than three months must be registered every year (July-June) as per the Dog Control Act 1996.

A Re-Registration Notice will not arrive in your letterbox until approximately 1 July.

Registration fee (inclusive of gst)

You can pay the 2010-11 fee, which falls due on 1 July 2010, at the Rolleston Offices or any Selwyn service centre, or you can use the envelope sent with your registration form. **You cannot pay via the internet or telebanking.**

If paid by 31 July 2010, the registration fee applicable is:

- \$30 for the first dog
- \$20 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Payment after 31 July 2010 will incur a penalty and the registration fee applicable is:

- \$45.00 for the first dog
- \$30.00 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Tag and Collar Fees

(inclusive of GST)

A replacement dog tag costs \$5; a replacement dog collar costs \$6-\$8 depending on the size required.

Seizure Fee

(inclusive of GST)

If the Council's Animal Control Officers seize a wandering dog, which can be readily identified by its current registration tag, then the officer has the discretion to charge the owner a seizure fee of \$45 upon return of the dog to the owner.

Impoundment Fees (inclusive of GST)

If the Council's Animal Control Officers impound your dog, you will have to pay:

- \$45.00 for the first impoundment
- \$67.50 for the second
- \$135.00 for the third

You will also have to pay:

- an administration fee of \$11.25 per impounding
- a food charge of \$32.50 per dog per day or part day
- the officer's travel time \$50.00 (flat fee)
- (where applicable) a destruction fee of \$11.25

(These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.)
