refuse collector. **101.1 Collection Times**

ALL wheelie bins and bags must be left at the kerbside/roadside before 7:30am on collection day (except for Main South Road between Rolleston & Templeton where the start time is 7am).

- Leave at least a half-metre space between wheelie bins, bags, and nearby trees and vehicles.
- Don't put bags beside or in front of bins
- Now there is a winter risk of ash fire. Dampen your

ashes and let them cool for at least five days in a



metal container before putting them in your rubbish wheelie bin.

And you could burn down your house or destroy the collection truck.

REMINDER! **Rebate Applications**

If you have not yet applied for your Rates Rebate for the current rating year you have only until Wednesday, 30 June, to do so.

If you pay the rates on the property you live at and your gross household income for the year ended 31 March 2009 was around \$22,000 or less, you may qualify for a rates rebate.

You can check out the rates rebate calculator and examples on the Department of Internal Affairs website www.ratesrebates.govt.nz or contact us for further information on 347 2800 or 318 8338.

You will need to give details of your gross income for the tax year ended 31 March 2009.

ALSO you may not apply for the 2010/2011 rates rebate until you have your new year's rates, which will be issued in August.

At Coes Ford the Selwyn River reached a maximum flow of 110 cumecs.

Lake Ellesmere (Waihora) reached a height of 1.4m before being opened to the sea at 11:30am on Monday 31 May.

Although there were no major incidents of flooding, there was surface water ponding throughout the District.

Heavy rain in the Brookside/Doyleston area

on Friday night and Saturday morning, 29–30 May, resulted in many local drains running to capacity. With water levels threatening homes, a couple of houses were evacuated as a precautionary measure.

From Wednesday morning until Saturday

Some facts and figures from the recent heavy afternoon, sandbagging and pumping operations involving SICON and Fire Service crews were underway in many parts of the district. Community/Neighbourhood Support groups checked on local residents, as well as helping keep locals and the Council informed on what was happening.

The Council now welcomes payments by internet banking.

Please remember that if making a payment by internet banking, it is important to quote the relevant reference e.g. building consent number, water billing A/c. number, valuation reference number for rates payments and debtor number.

This will ensure that your payment is credited to your correct account.

Hey, dog owners! It's that time again!



Dog registration starts in july

It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is registered, and the penalties for non-

registration can be expensive. All dogs older than three months must be registered every year (July-June) as per the Dog Control

A Re-Registration Notice will not arrive in your letterbox until approximately 1 July.

Registration fee (inclusive of gst)

You can pay the 2010-11 fee, which falls due on 1 July 2010, at the Rolleston Offices or any Selwyn service centre, or you can use the envelope sent with your registration form. You cannot pay via the internet or telebanking.

If paid by 31 July 2010, the registration fee applicable is:

- \$30 for the first dog
- \$20 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same

Payment after 31 July 2010 will incur a penalty and the registration fee applicable

- \$45.00 for the first dog
- \$30.00 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Change of Address

If you have changed your address since last year's registration, please contact this office to confirm your details.

LOST YOUR FAMILY PET OR LOOKING FOR A NEW ADDITION?

The Council's Animal Control officers place photos and details on our website of any dogs held in our pound and waiting to be claimed or adopted.

Tag and Collar Fees

(inclusive of GST) À replacement dog tag costs \$5; a replacement dog collar costs \$6-\$8 depending on the size required.

Seizure Fee

(inclusive of GST)

If the Council's Animal Control Officers seize a wandering dog, which can be readily identified by its current registration tag, then the officer has the discretion to charge the owner a seizure fee of \$45 upon return of the dog to the owner.

Impoundment Fees (inclusive of GST) If the Council's Animal Control Officers impound your dog, you will have to pay:

- \$45.00 for the first impoundment
- \$67.50 for the second
- \$135.00 for the third

You will also have to pay:

- an administration fee of \$11.25 per impounding
- a food charge of \$32.50 per dog per day or part day
- the officer's travel time \$50.00 (flat
- (where applicable) a destruction fee of \$11.25

(These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.)
