### REFUSE COLLECTION 101

A five-week course on how to avoid risks with your rubbish and please your refuse collector.

#### 101.2 Recycling

**MOST IMPORTANT!** Your bins must be put out **before 7.30am** on the morning of collection.

**Now the Good News!** – The quantity of recyclables has increased by about 30% since wheelie bins were introduced.

**Now the Not So Good News!** – Some householders are putting rubbish and garden waste in their recycling bins. Wrong material in a wheelie bin can cause a whole truck load to be dumped rather than recycled. If you get a sticker on your bin rejecting some items **DON'T** hide them in your bin until the next collection!

Check the sticker under the lid of your recycling wheelie bin lid to see what you can and cannot put in it. If the sticker is missing or you are still uncertain about items

for recycling, please phone the Helpline 347 2800.

#### General Guidelines

**YES** to the following:

Plastic containers, metal cans and tins, glass bottles and jars, paper and cardboard.

**NO** to the following (please read the list carefully):

Household rubbish, food waste, plastic foodwrap, engine oil bottles and car parts, paint and chemicals, hot ashes, garden waste, polystyrene, electrical goods and appliances, drinking glasses, ceramics (crockery, porcelain, and ovenware), disposable nappies, light bulbs, mirror glass, window or windscreen glass, bubblewrap.

## REMINDER! 2009/2010 Rates Rebate Applications

If you have not yet applied for your Rates Rebate for the current rating year you have only until **Wednesday, 30 June**, to do so.

If you pay the rates on the property you live at and your gross household income for the year ended 31 March 2009 was around \$22,000 or less, you may qualify for a rates rebate.

You can check out the rates rebate calculator and examples on the Department of Internal Affairs website [www.ratesrebates.govt.nz](http://www.ratesrebates.govt.nz) or contact us for further information on 347 2800 or 318 8338.

You will need to give details of your gross income for the tax year ended 31 March 2009.

ALSO you may not apply for the 2010/2011 rates rebate until you have your new year's rates, which will be issued in August.

## Hey, dog owners! It's that time again!



### Dog registration starts in July

It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is registered, and the penalties for non-registration can be expensive. All dogs older than three months must be registered every year (July-June) as per the Dog Control Act 1996.

**A Re-Registration Notice will not arrive in your letterbox until approximately 1 July.**

### Registration fee (inclusive of gst)

You can pay the 2010-11 fee, which falls due on 1 July 2010, at the Rolleston Offices or any Selwyn service centre, or you can use the envelope sent with your registration form. You cannot pay via the internet or telebanking.

If paid by 31 July 2010, the registration fee applicable is:

- \$30 for the first dog
- \$20 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Payment after 31 July 2010 will incur a penalty and the registration fee applicable is:

- \$45.00 for the first dog
- \$30.00 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

### Change of Address

If you have changed your address since last year's registration, please contact this office to confirm your details.

### Tag and Collar Fees

(inclusive of GST)

A replacement dog tag costs \$5; a replacement dog collar costs \$6-\$8 depending on the size required.

### Seizure Fee (inclusive of GST)

If the Council's Animal Control Officers seize a wandering dog, which can be readily identified by its current registration tag, then the officer has the discretion to charge the owner a seizure fee of \$45 upon return of the dog to the owner.

### Impoundment Fees (inclusive of GST)

**If the Council's Animal Control Officers impound your dog, you will have to pay:**

- \$45.00 for the first impoundment
- \$67.50 for the second
- \$135.00 for the third

You will also have to pay:

- an administration fee of \$11.25 per impounding
- a food charge of \$32.50 per dog per day or part day
- the officer's travel time \$50.00 (flat fee)
- (where applicable) a destruction fee of \$11.25

(These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.)



## TEMPORARY WATER RACE SHUTDOWN – PAPARUA SCHEME

The Council will be adjusting flows to allow culvert work on **Adams Road, West Melton and Tennyson Street, Rolleston** and telecommunications work on Kirk Road by Connectics. The races will be shut down from late afternoon on Monday 21 June until Thursday 24 June or the work is completed – whichever is sooner. **End of line users may take a little longer to have supply restored.**

If your dog was first registered after **30 June 2006** and is not a working dog, the law requires him or her to be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following places:

### Please note:

- The next clinic will be in August as there is no clinic held in July due its being dog registration time.
- Clinics last for only half an hour, except at Rolleston.
- The Rolleston venue is in Norman Kirk Drive (off Rolleston Drive).
- Microchipping will not take place if wet.
- Working dogs and dogs registered before **1 July 2006** can be microchipped for \$20 per dog.
