REFUSE COLLECTION 101

A five-week course on how you can avoid risks with your rubbish and make your refuse collector very happy.

101. Placing Wheelie Bins:



In the above photo the two bins to the left are too close to each other, and the middle bin is too close to the post. The bin in the right is just right!

The truck's arms can reach nearly two metres but they need space of about 500mm around bins so that their jaws can reach the bins without tipping other bins or hitting poles, trees, cars etc



In urban areas please place your wheelie bins at the kerbside and not by your letter box or boundary fence.

In rural areas if trucks have to go off the road they can damage the berm or even get stuck. Please don't put your bin more than two metres back from the edge of the seal or gravel shoulder.



The Council wants to know what residents think about a proposed site for a community park in Leeston.

In 2006, concern about the lack of outdoor spaces and facilities for older children, led to the decision to build community parks in five Selwyn townships.

Considerable progress has been made, with the completion of a Community Park at Darfield; a Community Park at Rolleston under construction; land purchased at Prebbleton and negotiations underway for a site in Lincoln.

Finding a suitable site in Leeston has proved difficult, but now an opportunity has arisen, to purchase a site in High Street, adjacent to Leeston Park.

Community Parks are designed to cater for young people of all ages, but particularly to allow teenagers to have their fair share of active, informal recreation opportunities.




