DRIVING TO THE CONDITIONS

Well, last week's slippery, ice-coated roads were definitely a reminder to us all to slow down and drive to the **conditions.** Now you'll realise there is a reason for my continual nagging on this subject!



Many Selwyn residents reported crashes they had seen, and told stories of cars not driving to the conditions, passing them at speed, and then later seeing those cars sitting on roadsides, possibly after skidding off.

Avoid becoming a statistic in icy conditions by:



- Looking out for shaded areas caused by high banks, hedges and tall trees, where the roads freeze sooner and ice may not thaw during the day.
- Remembering bridges can also stay slippery longer than other road surfaces.
- Remembering frost is more severe at daybreak; be prepared for this after it becomes light – it may not be frosty at 6am, it could be an hour or two later!

FIRE AT THE PINES PROBABLY DUE TO HOT ASHES

Advice in Council Call a few issues back, about ensuring that ashes are cold before putting them in a wheelie bin, was underlined recently at the Pines Resource Recovery

On Friday 9 July, smoke was seen coming from rubbish which was moving from the compactor into one of the bins destined for Kate Valley. Staff pulled the bin away from the compactor, the fire brigade was called, and a hook truck was used to empty the bin onto the pit floor where the rubbish was hosed down.

As can be seen from these photos, the heat was enough to burn paint from the outside of the bin.

This example emphasises the importance of not putting hot ashes in wheelie bins.
