

#### **QUAKE QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

#### This week's topic: Septic Tanks



#### Q. Is my damaged septic tank covered by the Earthquake **Commission?**

A. You will need to check this with the Earthquake Commission on 0800 326 243 or at www.eqc.govt.nz

> Now is the time to check, because you have less than 3 months to get your claim in.

#### How can I tell if my septic tank is damaged?

- **A.** Some symptoms to look for are:
  - a foul, rotten-egg, smell in the area of your septic tank
  - ponding or soggy ground around your septic tank
  - toilet not draining properly
  - liquid level in the tank sitting

well below the sewer inlet (you can easily check this through the tank mushroom)

#### What should I do if I see signs of damage?

A. Call a drainlayer to have the tank assessed.

You can also contact Environment Canterbury for advice on 0800 324 636.

Replacement or repairs to your septic tank might need a building consent. Please contact the Selwyn District Council's Building Department for advice on this.

If you would prefer to connect to a main sewer line (assuming that one is nearby), please contact Graeme Wild at Selwyn District Council on 347 2873.

Having done this race myself I can tell you the scenery is


beautiful and the race is definitely a challenge but you will feel very satisfied at the end!

#### DO YOU KNOW YOUR CORRECT ADDRESS?

During the recent earthquake event, finding some properties in order to offer assistance was made more difficult due to vague address details. While you and your family may know your address, a visitor may need to call emergency services and they will need to provide a correct address.

If you have a rapid number you should have this ready by your phone in case any emergency services are required. A rapid number is made up of 3 or 4 digits and is displayed on a blue marker by your property entrance. This marker needs to be clearly visible.
