# **GREENWASTE DISPOSAL TRIAL HAWKINS TIP SEPTEMBER 2010**

## **Attention Malvern Residents!**

The Council is running a one-month green-waste trial at Hawkins Tip in September to assess the viability of a possible service.

Car and trailer-loads of green-waste can be dropped off at Hawkins Tip each Saturday in September 2010, between the hours of 9am and 1pm. The waste will be shredded on site and carted to Rolleston for composting.

## The trial will commence on Saturday 4 and conclude on Saturday 25 September.

Hawkins Tip is situated off Cullens Road near its intersection with Bangor Road, near the Hawkins River bridge, about 5km west of Darfield. Dumping will be supervised, and the tip's gates will be locked outside of the open hours.

Only garden organic waste, such as prunings, plants, shrubs, weeds and grass will be accepted. Branches shall not be larger than 200mm in diameter.

The following types of waste will not be accepted: food waste, putrescible waste, timber, tree stumps, flax and cabbage tree fronds, hardfill, plastics, glass, metals, liquids, and rubbish.

# **DOGS IN RESERVES**

Recently there has been some confusion regarding the legal requirements to have dogs on leashes in the district. Two areas of concern are the Prebbleton Reserve where dogs are prohibited at all times, and Brookside Park where dogs must remain on leashes.

The Selwyn District Council website 'where can my dog go or (not go)?' is worth a look.

Here is an excerpt from the Selwyn District Dog Control policy which helps explain the issue.

## Dogs on Leashes

Every owner shall ensure that any dog under their control, being on a public place within "Restricted Speed Areas" or "Recognised Residential Areas" including roads, footpaths, public parks and reserves (other than those prohibited), must be under control by means of a leash attached to the collar of such dog at all times.

## **Dog Exercise Areas**

All areas, other than those where leashing applies or where dogs are prohibited, may be considered



exercise areas where dogs may be exercised off a leash but must still be under control.

A landscape enhancement plan has just been completed for the Rolleston Drive frontage of Ambrose Estate Reserve. # **PLAN CHANGES 8 AND 9**

Two Selwyn Plantation Board Limited requests seek to rezone Rural (Outer Plains) land to proposed Living 3 (Rural Residential) at two separate locations on Dunns Crossing Road, Rolleston. Both requests are seeking to incorporate new planning maps, objectives, policies, rules and related provisions into the District Plan to facilitate rural residential activities.

**CHANGES TO SELWYN DISTRICT PLAN** 

Plan Change 8 seeks to rezone 92 hectares of existing Rural (Outer Plains) zoned land to a Living 3 zone to provide a maximum of 125 rural residential allotments.

**Plan Change 9** seeks to rezone 72 hectares of existing Rural (Outer Plains) zoned land to provide a maximum of 100 rural residential allotments.

These plan change requests have been notified together as they have been received from the same requester, seek similar changes to the District Plan, and the two sites are located relatively close to one another.

## **BIN SPACING**

Our wheelie bin collection contractor is having problems emptying wheelie bins that are placed too close together or too close to poles and fences. The truck's lifting arm needs enough space to fit between bins without tipping or damaging adjoining bins or poles, etc.





Make sure that there is a spacing of at least 50cm between bins, or between bins and poles.

Contact our Helpline on 03 347 2800 if there isn't enough kerbside space to place your bin correctly; we will look at the problem and discuss it with the collection contractor.

In rural areas if trucks have to go off the roadway they can damage the berm or even get stuck. Please don't put your bin more than two metres back from the edge of the seal or gravel shoulder.

All bins must be out before 7.30am on the morning of collections.



**NATIONAL RAIL SAFETY WEEK 22 - 29 August 2010** 

**Never Run the Risk! Always Look Out for Trains!** 

When you fail to stop, give way, or go around barrier arms at a rail level crossing your chances of survival, if hit by a train are small. There have been eight crashes at rail level crossings in Selwyn since 2005, resulting in one tragic fatal and nine injuries.



Sadly these crashes are caused by inattention, impatience or ignoring warning signs and signals. A train travelling at 100km/h requires the length of 14 football fields to stop and it cannot swerve to

## **Rail Level Crossing Safety** The facts are simple!

## What you should always do at a rail level crossing:

- Always check that the railway line is clear before
- Obey the signals. Never attempt to drive under a barrier arm as it is closing, or around a closed barrier arm
- Never overtake a vehicle that has stopped for a train.
- Listen for warning bells and whistles; modern trains have become faster and quieter.
- Be prepared to stop at all railway crossings without signals, 'Stop means Stop'. It is very important to look carefully for any approaching trains. It is very difficult to accurately judge how far away a train is and how fast it is travelling.
- Never try to race the train over the crossing.
