BUILDING CONSENT AMENDMENTS



We are streamlining the way we deal with amendments to building consents.

When you submit an amendment you must pay a \$200 deposit, the same as for a building consent.

If the processing costs more than the deposit, you will need to pay the balance before the amendment will be released. If the processing costs are less than the deposit, you will be offered a credit.

GREENWASTE DISPOSAL TRIAL HAWKINS TIP SEPTEMBER 2010

Attention Malvern Residents!

The Council is running a one-month green-waste trial at **Hawkins Tip** in September to assess the viability of a possible service.

Car and trailer-loads of green-waste can be dropped off at Hawkins Tip each Saturday in September 2010, between the hours of 9am and 1pm. The waste will be shredded on site and carted to Rolleston for composting.

The trial will commence on Saturday 4 and conclude on Saturday 25 September.

Hawkins Tip is situated off Cullens Road near its intersection with Bangor Road, near the Hawkins River bridge, about 5km west of Darfield. Dumping will be supervised, and the tip's gates will be locked outside of the open hours.

Only garden organic waste, such as prunings, plants, shrubs, weeds and grass will be accepted. Branches shall not be larger than 200mm in diameter.

The following types of waste will not be accepted: food waste, putrescible waste, timber, tree stumps, flax and cabbage tree fronds, hardfill, plastics, glass, metals, liquids, and rubbish.

CHANGES TO SELWYN DISTRICT PLAN

PLAN CHANGES 8 AND 9

Two Selwyn Plantation Board Limited requests seek to rezone Rural (Outer Plains) land to proposed Living 3 (Rural Residential) at two separate locations on Dunns Crossing Road, Rolleston. Both requests are seeking to incorporate new planning maps, objectives, policies, rules and related provisions into the District Plan to facilitate rural residential activities.

Plan Change 8 seeks to rezone 92 hectares of existing Rural (Outer Plains) zoned land to a Living 3 zone to provide a maximum of 125 rural residential allotments.

Plan Change 9 seeks to rezone 72 hectares of existing Rural (Outer Plains) zoned land to provide a maximum of 100 rural residential allotments.

These plan change requests have been notified together as they have been received from the same requester, seek similar changes to the District Plan, and the two sites are located relatively close to one another.



HOW TO PLEASE YOUR WASTE COLLECTOR Rubbish Bags

- Bags must be tied, not stuck down with parcel
- Only white Selwyn District Council Official rubbish bags will be collected.
- Bags must weigh less than 15kg, because as shown, the collector has to throw the bag up some distance into the truck.
- Leave bags at the kerbside and don't put them any closer than 500mm to wheelie bins, etc.
- Sharp objects such as needles are prohibited... but other sharp materials such as glass metal etc will be accepted provided they are wrapped to prevent injury to the collectors.
