BUILDING CONSENT AMENDMENTS



We are streamlining the way we deal with amendments to building consents.

When you submit an amendment you must pay a \$200 deposit, the same as for a building consent.

If the processing costs more than the deposit, you will need to pay the balance before the amendment will be released. If the processing costs are less than the deposit, you will be offered a credit.

The application will be processed by the original processor where possible, and will be fast-tracked to minimise on-site delays. If you want to know anything about the amendment process, please contact **Building Customer Services** on 03 347 2839.

ROLLESTON COMMUNITY PARK FORMALLY OPENED

In spite of gloomy weather, spirits were not diminished when the Mayor, Kelvin Coe, and Reserve Committee Chairperson, Jens Christensen, officially opened Rolleston Community Park, the stylish and challenging hang-out for Rolleston young people, next to the library and community centre. Instead of cutting a ribbon, the Mayor and Jens gave volunteers, James Manson and Tayla Eggleton, starter pushes on two of the six inward-





facing swings, which hang from a hot orange hexagonal frame.

Rolleston's young people chose purple and orange as bright colour accents for the park, which has a range of activities with no limit to imaginative use. In the long term, a new community park is planned for the 42-hectare Recreation Precinct recently purchased by the Council, but the newly opened facility will have lots of use for up to ten years, while the Town Centre evolves

As for the new park, interest has already been shown in staging events there. Its expanse of smooth paving favours multi-use, including outdoor radio, skate demonstrations, barbecues, and dancing in the

The park's cost of \$385,000 has had a substantial injection from reserve contribution funds—funds which must be spent on providing recreation and community assets in the township in which the funds originated. These funds come from costs levied on developers, when they subdivide to create more residential lots in the township, and are not rates levied on households. Initial public feed-back suggests the funds have been well spent to provide the new park. Once daylight saving kicks in and warmer weather arrives, we expect participation by all sectors of the

GREENWASTE DISPOSAL TRIAL HAWKINS TIP SEPTEMBER 2010

(Ends on Saturday 25 September)

Attention Malvern Residents!

A reminder that car and trailer loads of greenwaste can be dropped off at Hawkins Tip each Saturday in September 2010, between the hours of 9am and 1pm. The waste will be shredded on site and carted to Rolleston for composting.

Hawkins Tip is situated off Cullens Road near its intersection with Bangor Road, about 5km west of Darfield, and is near the Hawkins River bridge.

Only garden organic waste, such as prunings, plants, shrubs, weeds and grass, and branches up to 200mm in diameter will be accepted.

Please note: The following types of waste will not be accepted – food waste, putrescible waste, timber, tree stumps, flax and cabbage tree fronds, hardfill, plastics, glass, metals, liquids, and rubbish.
