PAMPER, RELAX AND REFRESH DAY



DO YOU KNOW YOUR CORRECT **ADDRESS?**



If you have a rapid number you should have this ready by your phone in case any emergency services are required. A rapid number is made

up of 3 or 4 digits and is displayed on a blue marker by your property entrance. This marker needs to be clearly visible.

The consent process necessary for expansion of the Pines Wastewater Treatment Plant (PWTP) at Rolleston has taken another step forward. Submissions on the three consents, to be jointly heard, closed on Friday 20 August and totalled 32, some of which were in support of the proposal. The formal hearing by independent commissioners will take place on 18 and 19 October 2010.

The 15 submitters were invited to attend an informal pre-hearing discussion at the Council's Rolleston Headquarters on Monday 27 September. Six out of the 15 submitters met Council staff, **Cr Gary Doyle** and the Council's consultant for the project, MWH (Montgomery Watson Harza). The objective was to list the main concerns

raised in the submissions, clarify matters where required and to note various ways concerns might be addressed. These solutions, or others proposed by Council staff, could then form part of the consent conditions, if the commissioners agreed they were appropriate.

The main topics were air quality, aesthetics, groundwater quality and the operation of the plant. Council staff will be phoning submitters during the next two weeks to seek a basis for agreement. It is hoped that this will reduce the time needed in the formal hearing. Following the hearing, a decision is expected in early 2011.
