KEA CROSSINGS

In Selwyn district there are **four** kea crossings, one at Prebbleton School, one at Rolleston School, one at Leeston Consolidated School and one at Darfield Primary School.

A **kea crossing** has two purposes: it is used as a school patrol; **and** as a crossing point.

When a **kea crossing** is used as a school patrol and the **STOP** lollipops are extended into the road, cars must stop. When the school patrol is not in operation, it is just a crossing point whereby vehicles have the right of way and pedestrians must wait for a gap in the traffic and practice stop, look and listen before crossing the road.
