IS YOUR FARM DOG MICROCHIPPED?

Animal Control has noticed an increased number of working/farm-type breeds of dogs finding their way to our dog pound. Often, because it have no registration tag and no microchip, such a dog cannot be identified.

This is a timely reminder that all dogs must be registered and those registered **after 2006** must be microchipped. Although there is an exemption for working dogs we would encourage them to be done.

See below for details of the next microchipping clinic nearest you or call **Animal Control** on 03 3472800 or 03 318 8338.



If your dog was first registered after **30 June 2006** and is not a working dog, the law requires him or her to be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following places.

Please note:

- Clinics last for only half an hour, except in Rolleston.
- The Rolleston venue is in Norman Kirk Drive (off Rolleston Drive).
- Microchipping will not take place if wet.
- Working dogs and dogs registered before **1 July 2006** can be microchipped for \$20.40 per dog.



"HEY, WE'RE ON THE SAME ROAD"

Selwyn's soaring population growth means more cars on our roads, more bicycles, and more risk of them crashing into each other – especially as cycling becomes more popular.

Since 2007, Selwyn people have been injured in 15 reported crashes between cars and bikes. The blame was fairly evenly distributed – 8 drivers were at fault and 7 cyclists. Most were inattentive or not following basic road rules.

So this month, Selwyn drivers and cyclists are in for a bit of a rev-up through the **"Share the Road"** campaign. Its basic message is: **mutual respect.**

Cars and bicycles need to share the road, and drivers and cyclists need to respect each other's space – as well as staying alert and sticking to basic road rules.

The **"Share the Road"** message will be promoted via billboards, print advertisements, newspaper articles, radio advertisements, promotion via cycle clubs and cycle magazines, and new **"Share the Road"** drink bottles and stickers as giveaways.



Tsunami Warning

Tsunami (tidal wave) signs are now posted around Lake Ellesmere (Te Waihora) and Rakaia Huts, to alert people that, because they are in a tsunami evacuation zone, they should be ready to move to higher ground or inland, in the event of "strong earthquake shaking, unusual ocean behaviour or noise".

"Canterbury was lucky in February this year when the 2-metre tsunami triggered by the Chilean earthquake arrived here at low tide rather than high," said the council's Emergency Manager, **Wilson Brown.**

Last week's tsunami in Indonesia, which killed hundreds, is just the latest of many reminders that tidal waves can be devastating. The waves may reach the shore at irregular intervals, often without complete withdrawal of the previous waves. The first wave is not always the largest.

The tsunami evacuation zone signs have been erected at Rakaia Huts, Fisherman's Point, Taumutu, Timbervale Reserve (Lakeside Domain), Upper and Lower Selwyn Huts and Greenpark Huts.
