#### Who may stand for election?

Anyone can stand who lives in, or pays rates in, the Selwyn District, or is on the Selwyn electoral roll. For example, if you live in Christchurch but own land in Selwyn, you can stand for nomination.

Who may move or second nominations?

Only those who live in, or pay rates in, the committee's local rating area may move or second a nomination. In other words, only locals can choose whom to nominate.

#### Who may vote?

Community Centre.

Anyone can vote who lives in, or pays rates in, the committee's rating area, or is on the electoral roll

# DARFIELD WATER

Because of reduced flows in the Waimakariri River, the Darfield Water Supply has had to be

Garden watering in Darfield is now restricted, until further notice, to:

- **Even-calendar days** for even-numbered
- Odd-calendar days for odd-numbered properties
- Before 7am and after 7pm on the above days (to reduce wastage from evaporation).

Changes will be notified in the Malvern News and Malvern Record. Updates will appear in the Council Call pages of the Selwyn Times and the Central Canterbury News and on our website www.selwyn.govt.nz

These restrictions should not affect any stock or household use of water.

If water use does not fall sufficiently, stronger restrictions might be needed, such as:

- Handheld watering only (before 7am and after 7pm)
- Alternate day handheld watering (before 7am and after 7pm)
- A total ban on garden watering

You can read the full text of the decision at www.selwyn.govt.nz or at any council service centre or library. From the date of this notice, Plan Change 18 is amended in accordance with the decision.

Anyone who made a submission on Plan Change 18 may appeal to the Environment Court the council's decision. Appeals, which must be in the prescribed form as set out in Form 7 of the Resource Management Act Regulations, must reach the court within 30 working days of receiving notice of the decision from the council.



### **PATIENCE** PLEASE!

Please keep your cool on the roads this holiday season. Avoid taking chances when turning or overtaking, and remember these basic tips.



- letting others merge into traffic
- using indicators before turning or changing
- respecting cyclists and cycleways, and
- if you're a slower driver, pulling over to let others pass,

Watch out for children on the road. Young cyclists and pedestrians can be unpredictable and poor judges of vehicle speed – especially those who are learning to ride new bikes.

Keep an eye out for learner drivers. The holidays are a popular time to learn to drive.

Speed is one of the biggest road killers. If you feel rushed, please be patient and don't be provoked by other drivers' aggressive behaviour.

**Keep a safe following distance** from the vehicle in front.

The maximum speed limit for trailers is 90 kilometres per hour.

Don't fall asleep at the wheel. Instead:

- get plenty of sleep beforehand
- drive at times of the day when you are normally Get the full Terms of Reference at www.selwyn.
- take rest breaks (with a short walk or nap) every few hours
- if possible, share the driving
- get plenty of fresh air from the air conditioner or an open window

**Buckle up.** It's the driver's responsibility to make sure that all passengers are wearing safety belts. The law requires children to be restrained in approved child seats suitable to their size and weight. There is a \$150 fine for each person not buckled up.

(19-26 March 2011)


#### What's your school or community doing?

# **WAR MEMORIALS** DAMAGED THE EARTHQUAKE



We have completed a survey of works and costings for the repair of Selwyn war memorials damaged in the earthquake. We expect to begin repairs in early 2011 but are waiting for sign-off from the insurance assessors.

Damaged war memorials were made safe after the earthquake. To avoid further damage, the council has not removed any fallen pieces from the sites. All war memorials will be reinstated in time for ANZAC Day 2011.
