Anvone can stand who lives in, or pays rates in, the Selwyn District, or is on the Selwyn electoral roll. For example, if you live in Christchurch but own land in Selwyn, you can stand for nomination.

### Who may move or second nominations?

Only those who live in, or pay rates in, the committee's local rating area may move or second a nomination. In other words, only locals can choose whom to nominate.

## Who may vote?

Anyone can vote who lives in, or pays rates in, the committee's rating area, or is on the electoral roll

# **MINOR AMENDMENTS TO THE NOTIFIED** PLAN CHANGE AND EXTENSION OF **DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS**

Proposed Plan Change 12 is a review of the transport-related provisions in the District Plan. It was notified on 14 December 2010.

When the plan change was notified there were problems with the formatting of the proposed changes document. These include:

- Some new provisions to be included were not shown as underlined.
- Some text to be moved to different areas of the plan was not shown clearly.
- Some new provisions were shown as being both added and removed.

The Council has therefore produced and amended Plan Change document and has extended the timeframe for submissions until 5pm, Friday 4 March. Please note that there are no changes to the Section 32 report.

### Support for Selwyn residents

For Selwyn residents who face the stress of rebuilding homes and recovering their livelihoods after the Canterbury Earthquake the following services are just

- The Quake Support and Counselling Service (0800 777 846, 9am to 11pm seven days a week) helps those who are not coping or need
- The Earthquake Government Helpline (0800 779 997, 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturday) gives information and advice on income support, housing options, health issues, community assistance, Civil Defence or any other government service.
- Selwyn's Recovery Support Service Co-ordinator, Jenny Harkerss (027 435 2594, jenny.harkerss@selwyn.govt.nz) can help families develop recovery plans that suit their particular circumstances and put them in touch with the right support services. Jenny is based at the Community House in Rolleston.

### Facilities for residents in temporary accommodation

Quake-affected residents who have temporarily lost access to shower or laundry facilities are welcome to use the laundry and showers at the Rolleston Community Centre (David Pryor, 347 2882) and the showers at the Lincoln University Recreation Centre (Peter Magson, 325 3838 ext. 8898).

## **Building consents update**

We have now issued 38 earthquake damage related building consents, with processing taking two days on average. We have streamlined our building consents process (including final inspections) so that people can repair their homes as quickly as possible.

# Payment of building consent fees

Some customers have asked us to send the bill for their building consent directly to their insurers or the EQC. Unfortunately, we cannot do this. Whoever is managing the building project must pay the fees, and then seek reimbursement from the EQC or their insurer

If you are the project manager, then it's you who pays. If Fletcher or another contractor is managing on behalf of EQC or your insurer, then it is the contractor

### Final inspections

- Projects need to be completed before final inspections are booked.
- The council-approved plans must be on site.

If inspectors arrive to find incomplete work or missing plans, then the inspection will have to be rescheduled, causing further costs and delays. For more information on building consents, call our Building Team (03 347 2839).
