# MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE TRIENNIAL ELECTIONS AND ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS

#### Who may move or second nominations?

Only those who live in, or pay rates in, the committee's local rating area may move or second a nomination. In other words, only locals can choose whom to nominate.

# Who may vote?

Anyone can vote who lives in, or pays rates in, the committee's rating area, or is on the electoral roll in that area.



# **Selwyn District Plan Rolleston Wastewater** Treatment Plant (Pines II)

Decision on a Notice of Requirement & Alteration to an Existing Designation:

The Selwyn District Council has accepted the Independent Hearing Commissioners recommendation to approve the applications for a new notice of requirement and an amendment to the existing land use designation at its meeting on 8 February 2011.

The amended designation lets the council expand the plant and add drying beds for treated sludge.

The new Notice of Requirement allows more surrounding land to be sprayed with treated wastewater.

# **Earthquake Recovery –** Liquefaction in Selwyn

The Council has released its report on liquefaction within Selwyn.

The main area of liquefaction is a strip, varying in width from 0.5 km to 1.5 km, following the Halswell River from the district's north boundary at Halswell to Greenpark. There are also three much smaller areas - south of Prebbleton, near Motukarara and through Ladbrooks.

A Selwyn District Potentially Liquefiable Ground Zone has been established that incorporates these areas that liquefied and were subject to lateral spread in the 4 September earthquake, along with areas that could liquefy in future earthquakes.

The report, prepared by Geotech Consulting Ltd, also outlines appropriate foundation systems for new structures within the zone, and these are consistent with the Department of Building and Housing's recommendations.

The implications of the report for Selwyn residents are:

- Newly issued Land Information Memorandum (LIM) reports for properties inside the zone and within 300 metres of the zone will include a reference to the liquefaction risk.
- All new building projects within the zone will require a geotechnical report to verify ground conditions before a Council building consent can be issued. Appropriate foundation systems will need to be used for new structures, based on the findings of these geotechnical
