Anyone can stand who lives in, or pays rates in, the Selwyn District, or is on the Selwyn electoral roll. For example, if you live in Christchurch but own land in Selwyn, you can stand for nomination.

Who may move or second nominations?

Only those who live in, or pay rates in, the committee's local rating area may move or second a nomination. In other words, only locals can choose whom to nominate.

Who may vote?

Anyone can vote who lives in, or pays rates in, the committee's rating area, or is on the electoral roll

BOIL WATER NOTICE FOR MALUERN HILLS (HARTLEYS) WATER SUPPLY

The Hartleys water supply includes the areas of Whitecliffs, Glentunnel, Coalgate, Greendale, Waireka Extension and all farms connected to the southern section.

E.coli was detected in this water supply on 16 February, but 3 clear samples have now been taken and the water is **safe to drink.** Residents NO LONGER HAVE TO BOIL THEIR WATER. However, those with large storage tanks or who

have not used water on their property for the last

month should disinfect their tanks.

The Council is chlorinating this water supply and will continue to do so for the foreseeable future. Please phone us for information on how to disinfect your water tank or if you have any questions.

Earthquake Recovery – Complaints about EQC or insurance companies

If your property has been assessed by EQC or your insurance company and you have any concerns about the service you have received, it is your right to make a complaint.

The complaints process differs depending on whether you are dealing with EQC or a private insurance company.

How to make a complaint about EQC

In the first instance, you should voice any concerns you have about an EQC claim directly to EQC via their online complaints procedure (www.canterbury.eqc.govt.nz/complaints) or by calling them on 0800 326 243.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of the complaint investigation by EQC, you have the right to raise your concerns with the Office of the Ombudsmen. This is a free service.

How to make a complaint about a private insurance

Insurance companies have their own internal complaints procedures, and you should contact your insurance company in the first instance if you have a complaint.

If you still have concerns after speaking with you insurance company, you should contact the Insurance and Savings Ombudsman (the ISO) Scheme. The ISO Scheme is independent, impartial and free service to consumers designed to resolve disputes between consumers and insurance and savings companies.

Earthquake Recovery – Temporary Accommodation Service and Financial Support

The Government has announced a temporary accommodation package to assist Cantabrians who have been displaced from their homes due to severe earthquake damage. The package includes a temporary accommodation service and financial assistance of:

- \$180 per week for a one-person household;
- \$275 per week for a two-person household; and
- \$330 per week for households of three or more people.

Selwyn residents that require temporary accommodation now - or know that they will in the future - should call 0800 673 227 or visit www.quakeaccommodation.govt.nz to make an appointment to discuss their needs.
