



Green light for Selwyn's first community indoor aquatic centre



The council has approved a revised budget of \$13.7 million to build the Selwyn's exciting new Aquatic Centre. Construction will begin in the next few months, with the aim of opening late next year. Despite the increased budget, the targeted rate will remain the same with additional energy saving technology reducing the Centre's annual operating cost.

"The vision is for a quality community facility that Selwyn residents of all ages and abilities can enjoy." said Mayor Kelvin Coe, "It will serve everyone from babies splashing around in the toddler zone, to learners and school competitors, to people with disabilities and older folk enjoying the hydrotherapy pool or aquasize classes.'



Situated just south of Rolleston's town centre, the Selwyn Aquatic Centre will be the centrepiece of a future recreation and sporting hub said Mayor Coe.

The Council has also affirmed its commitment to ensuring the whole community has local access to outdoor pools where kids and families can play and learn to swim.

"We will continue supporting the five

outdoor pools around Selwyn as they play an important role in delivering a network of pools to our local community," says Mayor Coe.

Responding to submissions made to the Council last year, Council is also looking to assist schools that make pools available for public use via a small annual Council grant proposed in this year's Draft Annual Budget.'

"The Selwyn Aquatic Centre is a largescale project for the area, but not one Selwyn should shy away from. Selwyn is one of the fastest growing districts in New Zealand with an increasingly dynamic community that will continue to grow," says Mayor Coe.

In my role, I get a lot of "squeaky wheel" calls and emails on transport and road safety - and 10 times out of 10 I agree with them! So, every month, I'll share a few with you. It helps spread



the load and maybe we can even solve some! For openers, how many of these make your wheels squeak?



Drivers not switching their lights on in fog. Imagine turning into, say, Shands Road as a car with no lights suddenly barrels out of the mist at 90km/hour! Drivers in fog should always turn on their headlights – park lights are not bright enough.

Cars that park in cycle lanes in Prebbleton and Lincoln. Cycle lanes have been around for a while now, so we should all know

not to park in them. The council has even printed a windshield leaflet to remind drivers before they get a ticket. Aren't we kind? Cars that park too close to an intersection or a driveway. Here are the rules. You

can park 6 metres away from an intersection and 1 metre from a driveway or access way. Any closer is home invasion.

Railtrail residents exiting driveways without checking for cyclists. The principle here is the one that works so well at intersections: stop and take another look.

Invisible walkers and cyclists on the road verge at night. High visibility fluorescent apparel is a must when out on the road in dim light. Headlights alone are no guarantee that the driver will see you.

Horse poo on urban footpaths. Now we don't mind seeing a bit of horse exhaust on our country roads, but in the towns? Come on! Are horsey doo bags the answer?

Are you not sure if your chimney is safe to use?

It is getting colder at night and a lot of people in Selwyn rely on heating that uses a chimney or flue to keep warm.

The Fire Service and Selwyn District Council urge residents get these chimneys and flues inspected by a qualified person before using them this winter.

Home owners need to contact a builder or a heating installer to carry out these inspections.

Do you need help recovering from the earthquakes and not know where to turn?
