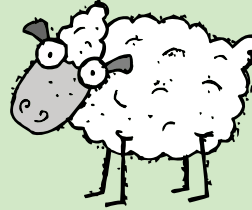

### Deadlines for making EQC claims

When there is a significant aftershock, the Earthquake Commission (EQC) classifies each one as a new event for insurance purposes.

What this means for people with new damage as a result of an aftershock is they have three months to contact EQC and lodge a new claim. It is recommended that home owners make a new claim each time they have new or worsening damage as result of a specific aftershock.

The outstanding deadlines for claims relating to specific aftershocks are:

16 April aftershock:	18 July
30 April aftershock:	1 August
10 May aftershock:	10 August
6 June aftershock:	6 September
13 June aftershock:	13 September

### Selwyn District water supply

The boil water notice that has been put in place after the 13 June aftershocks relates only to the Christchurch City water supply. Tap water in Selwyn District does not need to be boiled.

**If your main source of heating is damaged contact EQC on 0800 326 243**

You may be eligible for the priority heating programme – especially if somebody living in your household:

- has a medical condition or a disability
- is a young child
- is pregnant
- is vulnerable to the cold because of age.

If you are not sure if your chimney or flue has been damaged by the latest or earlier earthquakes, please get it inspected by a qualified person before using it.

**If you need any other earthquake related assistance or advice, there are services that can help.**
