The Selwyn River is full of gravel that can be removed to help reduce flood risk and erosion. Canterbury Regional Council staff can offer free advice and point you in the right direction, whether you need a small trailer load for that pothole in the driveway or you are planning to build a motorway and require thousands of cubic metres

If you need a trailer load, the Regional Plan will permit that as long as you comply with all the conditions of the relevant rule. You must also advise the Regional Council prior to taking gravel.

If you need more than the rule allows (up to 100 cubic metres per month, and not more than 500 cubic metres in any 12 consecutive months) see

If you need more than the rule permits then you have other options.

The Plan Change is concerned with the culture and heritage provisions of the District Plan which relate specifically to Wahi Taonga Management Areas and Sites in and around Rakaia Huts Township.

Stronger Selwyn

21 June aftershock classified as a new event by EQC

The Earthquake Commission (EQC) has classified the 21 June magnitude 5.4 aftershock as a new event for insurance purposes.

What this means is people have three months to contact EQC and lodge a claim for new or worsened damage caused by the aftershock.

Given the location of the aftershock, the Selwyn District Council urges residents to take a good look around their homes and check to see if they have any new damage.

If new damage is found, please lodge a claim by contacting EQC on 0800 326 243 or by visiting www.eqc.govt.nz.

EQC classifies each major aftershock as a new event and there are a number of outstanding deadlines for claims. These are:

> 16 April aftershock: 18 July deadline 30 April aftershock: 1 August deadline 10 May aftershock: 10 August deadline 6 June aftershock: 6 September deadline 13 June aftershock: 13 September deadline 21 June aftershock: 21 September deadline

Business assistance available from Recover Canterbury

Recover Canterbury has a team of Business Recovery Coordinators available to provide and procure business recovery assistance and advice to Canterbury businesses that have suffered damage or loss. The types of support available include financial assistance and grants, business mentoring and access to professional services.

Business owners can apply for financial assistance from the Canterbury Business Recovery Trust Fund managed by Recover Canterbury. It has been established to provide cash injections into strong but earthquake-affected businesses to ensure, firstly their survival and subsequently their revival.

Uses of the fund include, but are not limited to, such things as:

- Funding interest on loans over a critical period
- Connection to essential services such as telecommunications
- Restoration of damaged ICT hardware and files
- Access to expert advice and assistance
- · Funding a marketing campaign
