

Selwyn District trials new 40km/h Advisory Rural School Zone Signs

This week you may notice the new trial 40kph advisory signs at nine Selwyn rural school locations: Broadfield, Burnham, Greendale, Greenpark, Hororata, Ladbrooks, Weedons, Windwhistle and Glentunnel. So, **please** slow down to the advisory speed for the safety of our Selwyn rural school children.



Thank you to everyone that completed the pre-perception survey form, either via the Council website or at any one of the service centres. We received 231 surveys, which is a fantastic response. Congratulations to **Grant** of Weedons who won the \$100 New World voucher.

Fifty-nine percent of respondents said that if they were driving on a rural road at usual speed and came across this road sign they would slow down – whether or not they saw children. Forty-nine percent said they would slow down exactly to 40kph, and 38% said they would go slower than 40kph, just to be sure. The pre-perception survey information is an indicator that drivers in the community would slow down and adhere to the advisory speed.

Stronger Selwyn

Changes to the Building Code for Canterbury

In May, the Department of Building and Housing (DBH) announced changes to the Building Code to increase the seismic hazard factor for Canterbury and to require stronger foundations for buildings.

Architects, engineers, builders and even home handymen need to be aware of the changes.

What has changed?

DBH has increased the seismic hazard factor for the design of all buildings in Christchurch, Waimakariri and Selwyn by 35 per cent from 0.22 to 0.3 based on the best scientific and structural engineering advice available.

This means a change in some areas of Selwyn but for much of the District, particularly areas close to the Alpine Fault, the requirement is already greater than 0.3.

In addition, concrete floor foundations for housing will need to be tied and reinforced. This change was signalled in guidance on foundation repairs provided to the construction sector after the September 4 earthquake.

Where can the building industry find more information about the changes?

Architects, engineers, builders and home handymen taking on complex renovation or building projects should visit www.dbh.govt.nz and review the B1 Structure section of the Building Code, and make sure they understand all the changes.

If they have any questions about what the changes mean for building consents either recently issued consents or future ones - they should contact the Selwyn District Council's building team on 347 2839.
