

- Working dogs and dogs registered before 1 July 2006 can be microchipped for \$20 per dog.

Stronger Selwyn

Where will I live?

Selwyn people are now in the process of figuring out where they might live while repairs are carried out on their homes. For options, contact the Canterbury Earthquake Temporary Accommodation Service (CETAS), 0800 67 32 27 or visit www.guakeaccommodation.govt.nz.

Do I need building consents?

Some repair work will require consents, particularly structural work including bracing. Make sure you check with your builder, or contact the Council's building department, bca@selwyn.govt.nz, or on 347-2839 (Darfield residents can call the free phone HelpLine 318-8338) and ask for Building Customer Services).

Are my heating sources safe to use?

With winter upon us, many people in Selwyn rely on heating that uses a chimney or flue to keep warm. Residents are urged to get any chimneys or flues that may have been damaged by the latest or earlier earthquakes inspected by a qualified person. Home owners need to contact a builder or a heating installer to carry out these inspections.

If your main source of heating is damaged, contact EQC on 0800 326 243. You may be eligible for the priority heating programme – especially if somebody living in your household:

- Has a medical condition or a disability
- Is a young child
- Is pregnant
- Is vulnerable to the cold because of age.

If you need any other earthquake related assistance or advice, there are services that can help.
