Yubetsu Friendship Agreement celebrated



Library offers amnesty on missing books

During November Selwyn Libraries are offering a one-time chance to wipe old fines and return missing library books.

Library users can return any long-overdue items or pay off old fines by bringing in an item of food and this will be donated to the Ellesmere Food Bank.

Libraries Manager Glen Walker recommends one item of food per \$5 paid off, "but the choice is yours, we are not going to quibble".

"We're doing this so that we can recover lost items, bring people back into the library who may feel awkward about historic fines, and to reduce our outstanding debts before moving to a new debt collection system — **plus** we want to assist the Ellesmere Food Bank," he says.

Lost or damaged items, Interloans and rental fees are excluded from this amnesty and are still required to be paid for.

Toddler time sessions

Due to increased numbers attending the Rolleston Toddler Time session on Tuesday mornings at 10am the library is looking at trialing two sessions for Term 4. Both sessions will be on Tuesday mornings and the times are as follows:-
