Sustainable couple win top award

John and Liz Veix of Solar Electric Specialists have won the **Rolleston Responsible Business** Trophy, for their commitment to sustainability in all aspects of their lives.

Lincoln Envirotown Chairperson Sue Jarvis says the couple are an inspiration in the way they live

"Iohn and Liz make sure every item that can be reused or recycled is.

Energy consumption is minimal as appliances are bought to consume the lowest amount of energy possible.

Their garage is powered by solar electricity and is completely off the grid. Rinse water from washing is used on the garden and they're planning rain water collection systems," she says of their lifestyle.

For the last few years John and Liz have been organising and running Energy Expos around Christchurch and Rolleston.

They are the designer, installer and local agent/consultant for a range of solar electric (photovoltaic) and wind turbine systems including PV panels, wind generators, deep cycle batteries, charge controllers, inverters and inverter/chargers, energy efficient



appliances and lights; and water pumping applications.

The couple were presented with a petrified wood trophy donated by Rolleston Square Ltd by Geoff Banks at the recent award ceremony.

The Selwyn District Council has accepted the Commissioner's recommendation to approve Plan Change 7 with amendments.



The sign installation over the past few months followed six years of planning and consultation with residents, schools, the New Zealand Transport Authority and other interested parties, to come up with options for making our roads and our school children safer.

> The signs declare the area to be a School Zone and indicate that drivers should slow to 40km an hour if there are children present.

> The penalty for drivers who don't slow down when children are present within the rural school zone is a careless driving infringement notice and a fine of up to \$3,000.

Protecting your property from fire

As the summer arrives along with those North West winds, it's a good time to think about what you can do to protect your property, as much as possible, from fire danger.

Rural areas are particularly vulnerable because of the time it may take for emergency services

- Keep the grass green, mown, or grazed around your home
- Ensure that your property is easily identified
- Keep a hose connected and make sure it can
- Ensure that your driveway has at least four metres clearance (both width and height) and adequate turn round area for large vehicles
- Ensure easy access to water supplies
- Ensure any dead or flammable plant species and trees are removed and replaced with low
- Isolate flammable liquids
- equipment in a safe working order
- Dispose of ashes safely in a metal container and use approved incinerators
- Install multipurpose dry powder extinguishers in the house and outbuildings

These simple steps could make a huge difference to how much your property is damaged if you do have a rural fire.


