PROPOSED ONE-OFF EARTHOUAKE RATE

In the Draft 2011/12 Annual Budget, the Council is proposing a once-only earthquake recovery charge to ratepayers of \$135 in the coming year.

"Despite the resilience demonstrated by our community, the earthquakes have impacted the Selwyn community – at emotional, physical and economic levels," said Mayor Kelvin Coe.

"Although Council assets are well-insured and support has been forthcoming from central government, we have no choice but to ask ratepayers to cover a \$2 million shortfall from approximately \$15 million of total earthquakerelated damage.'

The \$2 million is for damage not covered by insurance or government subsidy, including:

- repairs to the likes of cemetery headstones tennis courts and some roads;
- the cost of earthquake-strengthening for some key community buildings;
- the excesses the Council has to pay when claiming on its insurance policies; and
- some additional community welfare support needed.

An alternative option is to fund the costs by a loan recovered over a longer period of time. For example, this could see ratepayers paying \$13 per year for 20 years.

You are invited to make submissions on this and other budget proposals by Friday 6 May 2011.

RAKAIA HUTS WĀHI TAONGA **MANAGEMENT AREAS Draft Plan Change 26**

The area in and around the Rakaia Huts settlement at the Rakaia River mouth is recognised as one of the most important archaeological sites in the South Island. The Rakaia Huts Moa Hunter Site was first identified in the late 1860s, and was investigated by Julius von Haast between 1869 and 1871. His findings were later used to identify and define a Moa Hunter culture in New Zealand. Subsequent work by other archaeologists found further archaeological material on the middle and upper terraces at the Rakaia River mouth.

A Conservation Management Plan (CMP) of the Rakaia Huts Moa Hunter Site was completed in 2009. It proposed a range of regulatory and non-regulatory tools to manage the threats to the site.

Selwyn District Council has now developed a draft plan change (PC26) to help manage these threats. The Plan Change alters those culture and heritage provisions of the District Plan which relate to wahi taonga management areas and sites in and around Rakaia Huts Township.

BACTERIA IN MALVERN RURAL WATER SUPPLY

Hartley's Intake (Coalgate, Glentunnel, Whitecliffs, Waireka and surrounding rural properties). Bacteria have been found in the Hartley's Intake water supply. Tests are underway to find the source and extent of the contamination. Until further notice, drinking water should be boiled for a minimum of three minutes. Dalethorpe Intake There is no need to **boil water** here. Although bacteria have been found in the Dalethorpe scheme pipes, the water is safe because of chlorine treatment.

Longer term solutions will be proposed by the council's water asset manager, **Hugh Blake-Manson**, at the May meeting of the Malvern Hills Rural Water Supply.



I retire this week, after nearly 21 years at the council and can't help looking back at the tremendous changes. I shudder to think how high our waste mountain would be if our old system had continued.



Back then, all the rubbish went to unsecured dumps that were scattered around the district, posing a risk to groundwater and public health and a litter nuisance in high winds.

Now we have no dumps and three separate collections - a recycling one, an organic one, and a rubbish one. The recyclable waste goes to Ecocentral Ltd in Christchurch. The organic waste is composted at our modern recovery park near Rolleston and the remaining waste is crushed into bundles that are trucked to the secure landfill at Kate Valley in the Hurunui

In our last residents survey, Selwyn's recycling collection became the first council performance indicator to get a score of 9 out of 10. It is a privilege to have helped bring this about and to have worked with a council that has been so committed to reducing the district's waste.

Because of these changes, Selwyn sends to the landfill only 260 kg of waste per person each year compared to the national figure of 580 kg/person. That's because around 40 percent of our kerbside waste is either recycled or composted.

Not bad. But we can do better. In the long term, 70-80% of Selwyn's waste could be diverted from the landfill if each household did a bit more recycling and composting and less tossing out. Unlike most other councils, Selwyn rewards residents for putting out less rubbish. Our collection options and targeted rates allow people to save money if they put out less waste.

Those savings are getting better all the time because the cost of trucking rubbish to the landfill is rising faster than recycling and composting costs - and will jump even higher when the Emissions Trading Scheme adds up to 25% to landfill disposal charges

Only by reducing our own personal waste mountains can we get closer to a really sustainable solution.
