Berm Maintenance Policy approved

The Council's new Berm Maintenance Policy confirms that Council will not mow berms adjacent to private properties. The policy also covers berm landscaping, maintenance and reinstatement. Council is discussing with township committees whether approaches to townships may need to be mown by Council. The policy comes into effect from 1 September, 2012.

Selwyn District Council Draft Long Term Plan 2012-22

Full copies and summaries of the Selwyn District Council draft Long Term Plan 2012-22 are now available from our service centres and libraries. Guided by the outcomes (goals) set by the community the plan sets out:

- what the Council is trying to achieve for the district over the next 10 years
- the range of services that we provide
- the level of performance that residents can expect from us
- how much we estimate the services will cost
- how much we estimate ratepayers will need to pay.

Please have a read and if you have any comments to make on the proposals. or ideas about better ways of achieving the community outcomes, write them down and send them to us. Written submissions must reach us by 5 pm on Monday 7 May 2012.

Hearings will be held on 28 and 29 May. Please say in your submission whether or not you wish to come to a hearing and talk to the councillors about your submission. Following the hearings, the Council will discuss the ideas submitted and then make its final amendments to the plan, which will then be adopted and become operational on 1 July 2012.

Visit to Japan proposed...

Selwyn residents are invited to participate in a visit to Akitakata, Selwyn Council's Sister City and Yubetsu (Malvern Community Board's Sister Council), proposed dates (not yet finalised) are 26 September to 11 October this year.

This is the 20th anniversary of the relationship with Akitakata, formerly Takamiya. Akitakata is a rural area with urban areas close to Hiroshima.

Yubetsu is an agricultural and scallopproducing area on the north coast of Hokkaido, Japan's northern-most island.

Malvern Community Arts Council will have an exhibition of more than 20 works on display in Yubetsu during the visit.

Participants can choose to go in the Selwyn Council group to Akitakata and then join a Darfield High School student group at Kyoto before going to Yubetsu with the Malvern Community Board group. Participants can fly back to Tokyo with the Darfield High School group if they wish to. Selwyn residents can choose to go to either Akitakata or Yubetsu.

Numbers are limited.

Selwyn residents are invited to Some nights in both Akitakata and participate in a visit to Akitakata, Yubetsu will be spent in homestay Selwyn Council's Sister City and accommodation with local families.

Miss Sumi Hayakawa, Darfield High School's Japanese teacher, who has a long relationship with these communities will be in Akitakata, Kyoto and Yubetsu with a school group at the same time.

Participants are expected to pay their own airfares, insurance, accommodation costs when not in homestays and for some of the arranged outings.

There is an expectation that Selwyn participants will host future visitors from Japan

A meeting to discuss dates, itineraries and costs and to hear from previous participants will be held on **Monday**, **23 April at 7.30pm** at the Darfield Service Centre. All interested persons are very welcome to attend.
