Your friend is right. You should not ride your bike at night or on wet days without a light! Drivers need to be able to see you from 100 metres away.

Front lights, reflectors on the back of your bike and on the pedals all help you to be seen by drivers. Wearing hi-viz or bright clothing also helps.

A by-election is required to fill the extraordinary vacancy for the above position arising from the recent resignation of Mr Ray Pearson.

Nominations

Nominations open on Thursday 10 May 2012 and must be made on the appropriate nomination paper available from the Selwyn District Council HQ, 2 Norman Kirk Drive, Rolleston or the Darfield Library/Service Centre, South Terrace, Darfield. Completed nomination documents must be received by the Electoral Officer no later than 12 noon on Thursday 7 June 2012. Each nomination must be accompanied by a deposit of \$200 incl GST, payable by eftpos, cash or cheque.

Candidates may submit a candidate profile statement and recent photograph for sending out with voting documents to electors, if an election is required. The requirements for profile statements and photos are included on the nomination paper.
