

# Prebbleton Community Attention Park update

Council staff are providing further designs for Council consideration following a recent Prebbleton Community Park meeting.

About seven years ago the Council committed to five facilities around the district tailored to youth needs (youth originally defined as between 11-18 years old), to be situated in Darfield, Rolleston, Prebbleton, Lincoln and Leeston.

In 2009 the Council bought a 6600sq metre piece of land on the edge of Prebbleton, specifically to use for a community park that would provide for the young people of the district.

Prebbleton's young people were invited to attend "conversation cafes" last year to discuss what they wanted. Council staff then put together a plan that provides some of their wish list, within the budget allocated.

The resulting design catered for young people at the lower end of the youth age range, with an emphasis on beginners scooter facilities and would not be challenging for those over 15-16 years old.

Following written and verbal feedback on the concept plans, Council organised a workshop facilitated by Chris Mene to look at ways to integrate the design into the wider park setting.

Between 80 and 100 people turned up to the recent workshop and the information collated is now available on the Council website – look in the What's Hot column on the home page, www.selwyn.govt.nz.

Ideas put forward at the workshop will now form the basis for two new options. The first will incorporate ideas into the existing plan and the second will come up with a new design which will still cater for scootering and skating, but minimise the appearance of the original concrete

When completed, these will be taken back to Council for final approval.



### **Nominations**
