DOG REGISTRATION STARTS IN JULY!



again when all dog applicable is: owners must ensure that their dogs are registered. The penalties for non-registration can be expensive. All dogs

older than three months must be registered every year (July – June) as per the Dog Control Act 1996.

The re-registration notice will not arrive in your letterbox until 1 July or just after.



Registration Fee (Inclusive of GST)

The 2012/13 fee falls due on 1 July 2012 and may be paid throughout the month of July. This may be done at the Selwyn District Council Rolleston offices or the Leeston, Darfield, Lincoln or Rolleston Library/Service Centres.

Alternatively, you may use the prepaid return envelope provided with your registration form or use telebanking/internet banking.

\$35.00 for the first dog

\$25.00 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Payment after 31 July 2012 will incur a penalty and the registration fee applicable is:

\$50.00 for the first dog

\$35.00 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Change of Address

If you have changed address since last year's registration, please contact this office so that your details can be confirmed.

Tag and Collar Fees (Inclusive of GST)

The fee for a replacement dog tag is \$5.00 and for a dog collar \$6.00 - \$8.00depending on the size.

(These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.)

Forums to discuss Selwyn dog rules

Public forums have been set up to discuss the Selwyn District Council's review of its dog bylaw and policy. Council has undertaken the review of the 2006 Dog Control Bylaw because of legislative requirements and it made sense to concurrently review the Council's Policy on Dogs. Proposed changes identified by a working party set up to review the rules include a requirement that people with a dog in a public place must carry a container for removal of dog faeces, and that Council might in future allow dogs off-leash on reserves when they are not in use for sports or organised events. The following forums have been set up for the public to hear and comment on the review's findings:

Written submissions must be received at the Selwyn District Council by Friday, 3 August.

Winter reminders for cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders

Even though the evenings get darker earlier, there are still many cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders on our roads and roadsides at dusk. In this light they are hard to see, particularly if they are wearing dark clothing.

It's great that people still choose to walk, run and ride their horses at this time of day but please remember that although you can see car lights clearly as they approach you, you are not so visible. Bright clothing and a "high vis" vest doesn't make you bulletproof but goes a long way to help the driver see you earlier.

Although, I do see many cyclists



with a "high vis" vest, it would be great if everyone wore these. Lights and reflectors on bikes are essential and increase your visibility from at least 100metres.
