Applications invited for Selwyn Natural **Environment Fund**

Grants to help landowners protect and manage indigenous vegetation, wetlands and wildlife habitats on their land are available from the Selwyn District Council.

The Selwyn Natural Environment Fund has given almost \$160,000 in assistance to 48 restoration and protection projects since 2006.

Fund manager SDC Strategy and Policy Team planner Andrew Mactier says previous recipients include farmers protecting and restoring native vegetation from dryland shrub and wetlands through to podocarp forest; community groups and primary school environmental groups establishing and managing new native plant sites; and part funding for a native beetle survey carried out by Lincoln University.

Kev criteria Council looks at when considering projects is evidence of commitment to the project by landowners or managers, particularly in planning and management to ensure the project's long term success and sustainability.

The project needs to benefit the natural environment and increase native biodiversity. Projects looking to merely beautify areas are not considered, there must be an ecological benefit.

Typically Council will fund up to \$5000 per project, with an expectation that landowners also make a similar contribution of resources.

Damaged Greenpark Hall to be demolished

The badly damaged Greenpark Hall is to be demolished in the next fortnight. Council Assets Property Co-ordinator Karen Bartlett says the Council has been working closely with its insurers over the future of the seven earthquake-damaged buildings owned by the Council. A decision was made that it was uneconomical to repair the Greenpark Hall, because of the extent of the damage.

"The Greenpark Hall Committee and the local community will be involved in discussions over options for a future facility," Ms Bartlett says.

The other Council-owned buildings that have been closed due to earthquake damage include: Doyleston Hall, the Sheffield Memorial Pool changing rooms, Lakeside Community Memorial Hall, Dunsandel Hall, Glentunnel Post Office and Tai Tapu Library.

Sometimes it's obvious when you need your lights on, but after sunrise and before sunset it can still be incredibly hard to




have you seen a row of traffic coming towards you with one in the line that doesn't have its lights on? That one is very hard to see, particularly if the car is grey or a dark colour.

Dogs must be under effective control

Two recent incidents at the Rolleston Dog Park have prompted the Council's Senior Animal Control Officer Steve Clarke to call on dog owners to control their pooches.

"Dogs have to be under effective control at all times – and that applies to dogs being walked on leads around the Selwyn District as well as in the Foster Park Dog Exercise Area where



there are other dogs off-leash," Mr Clarke says.

Council staff are investigating the two incidents to see if dog owners have breached current rules.

"Dog owners need to be aware that if their dog isn't used to the socialisation that occurs there with dogs interacting, then they need to avoid using the facility when other dogs are around."

Any issues with dog behaviour should be communicated to the Council Animal Control Team via the 347 2800 helpline.

Forums to discuss Selwyn dog rules

District Council's review of its dog bylaw and policy. Council has undertaken the review of the 2006 Dog Control Bylaw because of legislative requirements and it made sense to concurrently review the Council's Policy on Dogs. Proposed changes identified by a working party set up to review the rules include a requirement that people with a dog in a public place must carry a container for removal of dog faeces, and that Council might in future allow dogs off-leash on reserves when they are not in use for sports or organised events.
