Ellesmere Heritage Blessing and Signing of Lease

A ceremony performed by kaumatua from Ngati Moki, Taumutu Marae was held to bless the site and buildings of the Ellesmere Heritage Park at Leeston. The blessing was followed by the signing of the lease with the Selwyn District Council by the Mayor Kelvin Coe and Grant Clausen Trust Secretary, paving the way for the practical development to begin.

Over the last 16 months since the initial public meeting to confirm support for the project, an incorporated Trust has been established and registered with the Charities Commission. Committees have been set up to oversee the various tasks of Finance, Planning, Archives, Promotion and Education, Fund Raising and Sponsorship, Buildings and Maintenance. The Ellesmere Historical Society having similar aims has agreed to work alongside and with the Heritage Park.

The next few months will be spent preparing the site for an official opening later in 2013.

Online Wellbeing Survey goes live soon – have your say

SOCIAL RECOVERY

How do you feel about the progress of the recovery and your day to day life?

The self-select version of the Wellbeing Survey, which goes live online on **15 October**, will help CERA and other agencies working on recovery to better understand people's perceptions and experiences.

From 15 October to 2 November all residents can take part in the survey by visiting www.cera.govt.nz

Nielsen is undertaking a survey of 2,500 greater Christchurch residents aged 18 years and over who were randomly selected from the Electoral Roll. The second stage of the Wellbeing Survey is the self-select version of the survey which will give all residents the opportunity to provide insights and feedback.

CERA General Manager Community Wellbeing **Michelle Mitchell** says all residents of greater Christchurch are encouraged to participate in the online survey.

"It is open to everyone, as we want to understand everyone's experiences not just those who have been most affected. This is an important opportunity for people to tell us what they think about how things are going."

Survey questions cover issues like quality of life, stress, how connected people are with others, satisfaction with the recovery and the positive impacts people are experiencing. CERA and its partner agencies will use the Survey results to identify where more support, assistance and resources may be needed and to enhance areas that are going well. Results will be presented in the Canterbury Wellbeing Index on the CERA website in early 2013.
