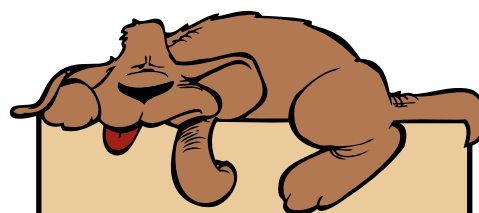


Flax Weaving

Resource Consents @Selwyn

Because of their possible environmental effects, many activities need a resource consent from the Council.

You have the right to inspect the full consent application received by council at any Council Service Centre during normal office hours or view on the council website www.selwyn.govt.nz and make a submission supporting or opposing the proposal.

Any person may make a submission but a person, who is a trade competitor of the applicant, may do so only if that person is directly affected by an effect of the activity to which the application relates that

- (a) adversely affects the environment and
- (b) does not relate to trade competition or the effects of trade competition.

CERA Wellbeing Survey

How are people in Christchurch feeling about day-to-day life and the progress of the recovery?

What's happening with stress levels as the recovery takes shape?

The CERA Wellbeing Survey is designed so CERA has a better understanding of how people in greater Christchurch feel. It is a partnership between CERA, the Christchurch City Council, Waimakariri District Council, Selwyn District Council, the Canterbury District Health Board, Ngai Tahu and the Natural Hazards Research Platform.

The first of two stages is a random, representative survey to ensure the results represent the views of greater Christchurch residents. Nielsen, the company carrying out the research, is surveying 2500 greater Christchurch residents aged 18 years and over in Christchurch city, Selwyn and Waimakariri districts. Questions cover issues such as stress, quality of life, social connectedness, satisfaction with the recovery and positive and negative impacts people are experiencing.

This survey runs from **29 August to 14 October**, with results available as part of a CERA Canterbury Wellbeing Index in early 2013. CERA encourages people to complete the survey if they are invited to participate.

The second stage of surveying gets underway from 15 October. The survey content will be exactly the same as the random survey. However, all people in greater Christchurch will be able to complete this online survey. This recognises that everyone in the area has been impacted by the earthquakes and may want to share their views. Results will be analysed for the common themes and issues and will help broaden the understanding of perceptions of recovery in greater Christchurch.
