



Roof trusses have been erected and roof framing has been mostly finished, except for a small central area. The main entrance canopy framing and ply linings are nearly finished.

The construction of the centre is now expected to be finished by early April due to delays with materials over the Christmas period.

Headstone repairs underway at Springston

Repairs to cemetery headstones at Springston cemetery are now underway. 170 headstones in the cemetery need repair as a result of earthquake damage.

The Council has allocated a budget of \$230,000 to complete headstone repairs at cemeteries across the district.

Work on Greendale cemetery, where earthquake damage was most severe, was completed last year. The Council plans to complete all repair work in the district within the next three years, and will be staging the work and focusing on the worst affected cemeteries first.
