Changes to building consent processing

Selwyn District Council is now accepting and processing all building consent applications electronically. We expect to have a very busy period ahead while we support the community through this exciting growth phase. Making this change allows us to focus on providing timely and efficient service. It also creates time savings for you, as you can submit all your building consent applications without leaving your home.

What does this mean for you?

- You can now lodge your building consent on-line
- Your supporting documents can also be submitted electronically
- The electronic system is Windows-based You can save time by doing this from your office or home by visiting www.seiwyn.govi. nz/buildingforms
- You can come into the Building Services counter with your information on a data stick and we'll assist you to electronically complete the application and upload your documents
- You will also be able to track the progress of your application on-line if you've made an electronic application

Prohibited Fire Season

been declared in Selwyn District, with effect from Friday 1 March.

Under the restrictions no outdoor fires can be lit in the district. The burning of crop stubble is also not allowed. Gas barbeques with a high pressure water source at hand are allowed but not charcoal barbeques.

The district's Principal Rural Fire Officer Wilson Brown says that the fire risk is extreme. "We moved into a restricted fire season following a brief spell of rain, but the district is once again very dry, so its appropriate that a prohibited fire season be declared."

"We recognise that restrictions on the ability of farmers to burn crop residue will be frustrating but our primary focus must be on reducing the fire risk in the district in order to protect lives and property."

A prohibited fire season has Mr Brown says the Council will • be reviewing the prohibited fire season status regularly and will lift restrictions as soon as it is considered safe to do so.

> During a prohibited fire season all fire permits previously issued by the Council are cancelled.

Reducing fire risk

You can help to reduce the fire risk, and make sure that fire services can quickly access your property to put out a fire if one does start, by:

- keeping the grass green, mown, or grazed around your home
- making sure your property number is easy to see
- keeping a hose connected that can reach round the house
- ensuring that your driveway has an access way which is at least four metres wide and high so that a fire engine can get in and out

- storing firewood and other flammable materials away from the house
- regularly check and maintain machinery and equipment so it is safe to operate
- disposing of ashes safely in a metal container and use approved incinerators
- keeping grass away from under hedges

Certain types of plants are more flammable than others. To find out more about planting less flammable species and reducing fire risk on your property visit www.selwyn.govt.nz/fire and select the 'fire safety' link.



If you see a fire burning out of control, phone 111 immediately to report it.

You called

Every day Council staff take an average of 540 calls. These can range from people asking what the opening hours are at their local library, wanting to know whether they need a building consent, or reporting a stray dog in the neighbourhood.

Every call and online request we receive is recorded and prioritised. Some of the types of calls that are responded to most quickly include a situation where people could be endangered by a problem - such as a tree blocking a road or problems that affect a large number of properties – like a loss of water, which will be dealt with within an hour or two. For less urgent issues, the request will be assigned within three days.

Last year we received around 200,000 calls and 6,861 service requests. Many of the service requests we receive are asking for a new water connections, rubbish bins and water meter readings. These calls are often from people who are new to the district. The number of requests we receive each year has also been growing by about 4% as our population grows.

Using our online service request form is an easy way to get in touch with the Council if your request is not urgent – it's available on our website under the 'helpline' link.

We also receive a large number of calls about our roads, water, stockwater and reserves. 100% of the service requests we received last year were actioned.
