# **Prohibited Fire Season**

A PROHIBITED FIRE SEASON remains in force over the whole of the Selwyn District until further notice.



During the Prohibited Fire Season, it is an offence to light any fires in the open air. The prohibition does not apply to gas barbeques lit on a property serviced by a high-pressure water supply.

# **Minimise Fire Risk**

The fire risk in Selwyn continues to remain high. There are a number of steps you can take to reduce the risk of fire starting or spreading on your property:

- keep a clear space between your house, and buildings and vegetation like trees, shrubs and long grass, to act as a fire break. Keep this space watered and green if possible or construct it from non-flammable material like paving stones
- make sure your property number is easy to see, and that it has a clear access-way four metres wide and high so that fire services can easily access your property if needed
- keep a hose connected that can reach round the house
- store firewood and other flammable materials away from the house
- regularly check and maintain machinery and equipment so it is safe to operate
- dispose of ashes safely in a metal container and use approved incinerators
- keep grass away from under hedges

Check you have adequate insurance cover for fire – it should include cover for fire damage, fire fighting and public liability insurance.



# Take another intersections

The Council is starting a "Take another look at intersections" campaign this week. Over the past 5 years, 37% of all crashes recorded in Selwyn District have happened at intersections. 446 recorded crashes resulted in 3 fatalities, while 61 people received serious injuries and 240 people minor injuries.

New billboards, advertising, and road safety resources will be used to increase driver awareness of the basic rules that apply at intersections. They are designed to reduce the number and severity of intersection crashes in Selwyn District.

Simple messages like "take another look at intersections" and "stop means stop! No excuses, no exceptions" are used to support the campaign. Call in to a Council library or service centre to pick up your free note pad or pen.

# **Funding to grow** your business



Selwyn businesses are being invited to apply for assistance from a subsidised business support programme which can provide funding for advice, training and mentoring. It is designed to help businesses wanting to expand, develop new products, target new markets, improve their customer service or business operation.

"Selwyn is a fast growing district and we have a number of new businesses which want to expand but need some advice and assistance to be able to do so" says Anne Hindson, Selwyn Business Training Advisor. The programme is available to local GST registered businesses with up to 50 staff, and is directed at owners, managers and senior staff. It is funded by New Zealand Trade and Enterprise.

In the past, workshops have been held at Selwyn District Council offices, but this year these workshops will be replaced by courses run by independent providers. Business owners can select from a range of courses on offer at venues throughout the Canterbury region. Courses cover topics such as strategic planning, finance, marketing, governance and health and safety.

Programme funding can be used to contribute towards up to 50% of the cost of training, consultants' fees, mentoring and a broad range of workshops for eligible businesses.
