Lifting of Fire Restrictions

Notice is hereby given that the previously advertised Restricted Fire Season, which extended over the Plains area of Selwyn District, is lifted from midnight Thursday 11 April 2013.

Fires may now be lit in the open air without a Fire Permit. Restrictions may be re-imposed at a later date if changed weather conditions create a potentially dangerous fire situation.

All residents are requested to take care when lighting open-air fires and are reminded that legal liability for costs associated in fighting an uncontrolled fire lie with the person lighting the fire.

Before lighting an open-air fire, due attention must be given to weather conditions, adequacy of firebreaks, and the patrolling of fires until completely out, and it is requested that fires not be lit after dark.

Notes:

1. A permanent Restricted Fire season remains in place for the Hill and High Country of the District.
2. Property owners are reminded that for the Department of Conservation Estate and Fire Control Areas, fire control measures are in place all year and that organisation should be contacted for a Fire Permit prior to any burning.
3. No fires may be lit in residential areas without a Resource Consent from Environment Canterbury.

Have your say on the future of our roads

We're now consulting on our draft Annual Plan for 2013/14. One of the issues we would like to hear your views on as part of the consultation is on how much we should spend on roading in the future.

The cost of maintaining our roads is funded by a mix of the general rates paid by rate payers, and subsidy from the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA). NZTA is providing funding for a series of major road improvements nationally, and will have less funding to allocate to our sealed and unsealed local roads. Because our population is growing rapidly, our roads are also being used more heavily, including for freight. As a consequence they are showing signs of deterioration, like increasing numbers of pot holes and larger-scale pavement repairs.

The Council has identified the need to increase the budget for road renewal by \$1 million to keep roads maintained to the same standard they are at the moment. Next year we have been able to spend more on roads by using additional interest revenue, including money from the proposed liquidation of Selwyn Investment Holdings Limited, and by reducing spending on some projects. However, this is a short term solution and we will need to consider how to resolve this challenge in future years.

If we were to spend an extra \$1 million on road maintenance and renewal, our general rates would need to rise by 10%. In the future, if the Council continues to use the extra interest

revenue from the proposed liquidation of Selwyn Investment Holdings Limited (without taking measures to inflation-proof its cash balances), we can meet about half this cost. Ratepayers would need to fund a 5% increase in the general rate and Uniform Annual General Charge. For a \$500,000 property this would cost \$28 more per year.

We would like to know how you think we should respond to having a lower level of NZTA subsidy for roading when our roads are being more heavily used. Should we spend more on roads – and if so, would you want to pay more in rates or reduce expenditure on other council services? Or should we not increase spending on our roads and accept that there will be less road resurfacing and less road maintenance done, making them rougher?

Recycle your old TV

Canterbury will switch over to digital TV on 28 April. You don't need to buy a new TV to go digital. However, if you do decide to upgrade, please dispose of your old TV responsibly.

TVs contain materials, like lead, that are hazardous to the environment and people's health if they are dumped in landfills or into the environment, so they should be recycled.
