

Selwyn Aquatic Centre opens soon



The new Selwyn Aquatic Centre will open on Monday 24 June.

The centre will be open from 6am – 9pm, Monday to Friday, and 8am – 8pm on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.

The complex includes an eight-lane 25 metre pool, a hydrotherapy pool with spa area, a learn-to-swim pool and a leisure pool with a lazy river. The four main pools have walk-in access to ensure they are accessible to everyone. A disability hoist will also be installed beside the spa pool so anyone can use this.

The centre will offer water jogging and aquacise classes. It's at 71 Broadlands Drive off Goulds Road in Rolleston.

TV Takeback Program

The Council reached its target of 1,810 TVs sooner than expected for the Ministry for the Environment funded TV recycling scheme. As other areas of the greater Christchurch area have not reached their targets, we have been allocated another 800 TVs that can be recycled.

TVs can be recycled at the Pines Resource Recovery Park on Burnham School Road during normal opening hours (Monday to Friday 9am – 4.30pm, Saturday/Sunday 10am – 4pm).

They can also be recycled at the Sicon Yard in Darfield on Mathias St. This will be open for collection on 15 June from 9am – 3pm.

TVs will be collected under the Ministry for the Environment program until the limit of TVs we can accept has been reached. The number collected will be updated weekly on Council's website.

Draft Local Alcohol Policy consultation

Consultation has opened on a draft Local Alcohol Policy for Selwyn District. The policy will control the trading hours and location of venues that sell alcohol in Selwyn.

Council staff will be available to answer questions on the draft policy at two drop-in sessions on:

- Wednesday, 12 June, from 4.30 – 7.30pm at the Darfield Recreation and Community Centre, (Darfield Domain, North Terrace)
- Tuesday, 18 June, from 5.30 – 8.30pm at the Rolleston Community Centre (94 Rolleston Drive).

Consultation on the draft policy closes on 5 July 2013.

If your dog was first registered after 30 June 2006 and is not a working dog, the law requires they be microchipped. This free monthly service is available at the following places.

Please note:

- All clinics last for only half an hour.
- The Rolleston venue is in Norman Kirk Drive (off Rolleston Drive).
- Microchipping will not take place if wet.
- Working dogs and dogs registered before 1 July 2006 can be microchipped for \$20 per dog.

Driving in the rain and on wet slippery roads.

So often after a spell of fine weather, we get periods of heavy rain, much of which does not drain away quickly because the ground is still very hard. Drains at the side of the road also often get blocked by leaves and debris and this can cause temporary flooding.



Darfield

It is very important in wet weather to keep your speed down, and keep extra watch for pedestrians, cyclists and motorcyclists. Always indicate and use your lights on the dip setting. Park lights only minimally improve visibility in wet weather and should not be used unless your vehicle is parked.

Stopping distances nearly double on wet roads. When you're driving you should:

- slow down and keep a generous following distance between you and the car in front
- be extra careful and take corners slower than usual
- pay attention to road signs warning of flooding and remember that you will need more time to stop and avoid all hazards in wet conditions.

The two-second following distance rule should become the four-second rule in wet conditions.

Register your dog

It's time to register your dog. All dogs older than 3 months must be registered every year (July-June) under the Dog Control Act 1996. The penalties for non-registration can be expensive.

If you have registered your dog before and your address has not changed, your re-registration notice will arrive in your letterbox, but not until 1 July or just after.

Registration Fee (Inclusive of GST)

The 2013-14 fee is due on 1 July 2013 and may be paid during the month of July.

This can be done at our Rolleston Headquarters or at service centres in Leeston, Darfield, Lincoln or Rolleston Library.



Alternatively, you may use the prepaid return envelope provided with your registration form or use telebanking/internet banking.

If paid by 31 July 2013, the registration fee applicable is:

- \$35 for the first dog
- \$25 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

If you pay your fees after 31 July 2013, you will incur a penalty and the registration fee applicable is:

- \$50 for the first dog
- \$35 for each additional dog owned by the same person and held at the same locality.

Change of Address

If you have changed address since last year's registration, please contact the Council on 347 2800 or 318 8338 so that your details can be updated.

Tag and Collar Fees (Inclusive of GST)

The fee for a replacement dog tag is \$5 and for a dog collar \$6 – \$8 depending on the size.

These fees and charges are set under Sections 37, 38 and 68 of the Dog Control Act 1996.
